





NWR Social Isolation

Social isolation and the problems associated with it engendered much discussion and interest. Loneliness is not being alone but a subjective experience of isolation. If this feeling persists it may become chronic which is often difficult to treat and can lead to serious health issues. Some surveys claim that the social groups showing the highest percentage of loneliness are: older women living alone; divorcees; new mothers; people in continuous poor health and surprisingly, 16-24 year olds. Loneliness and social isolation can affect any one of us when we experience life-changing events such as moving to live in a new area or facing a bereavement. Missing out on social opportunities due to physical disability, or simply not having the time to spend with friends because of medical commitments can lead to crippling loneliness and getting the right support for these people is so important. It was good to hear that there are many organisations and schemes available for people to join which offer practical and emotional support including the NWR that offers women social connections.

Easter traditions

Our second March meeting took us down memory lane, recalling particular ways in which we celebrated Easter in our childhood. The main features we recalled were of visiting extended family, church attendance and receiving chocolate eggs. One member's experience of beautiful singing in her uncle's church led

to a life-long appreciation

of Easter music, while another still remembers that her father used to break up her chocolate egg and she was allowed just one piece a day. Several of us received new outfits for Easter: lovely dresses, socks and pretty underwear were mentioned. A couple had enjoyed Easter egg hunts in the house or garden, though in one case the dog apparently collected more than the children! Traditional foods included hot cross buns on Good Friday-from the baker, not year-round pre-packed from the supermarket as they are today; roast lamb or chicken, and simnel cake which dates back to medieval times though the origins of the name are unclear including a disagreement between a couple called SIMon and NELly which ended in compromise, or more probably comes from the Latin simila meaning finest white flour. One belief is that young girls in service were allowed to take a cake home on Mothering Sunday though this was not widespread. More recently, foreign traditions have crept in and we heard about dying hard boiled eggs, the Polish custom of being at home with family and extensive celebrations in Germany including the extravagant pre-Lent Karnaval and exquisite painted eggs hung from spring branches or from

His first clients lived in the 'landed gentry' section of society, with three of them in close proximity in the same property. He had to pit his wits against the conflicting passions and wishes of his clients to ensure that their lives and his were not upset. One of his first battles was with a huge Wisteria to make it spread and bloom, and not to be removed by chain saws, was a major success which set his career on the right track. He professed that his advance in technology had not moved further than the ubiquitous spade. He highlighted his delight in the colour and variety of blooms, whether in bush and tree form or smaller plants. His enthusiasm for the Gardening World has led him to be a regular contributor to the 'Dig it' gardening programme on BBC Radio Surrey. His message to gardeners was to delight in colour and variety and be adventuresome.


To conclude another season of interesting talks, our March guest was David Peacock, the Newbury historian. His topic was Donnington Castle, which proved to be fascinating.

Richard Abberbury, who fought with the Black Prince, was granted a licence in 1386 to build the castle. The intention was to have an impressive home for a knight rather than a military post. It commanded the area with its view over the Kennet Valley & to Beacon Hill. In Tudor times it is known that Henry VIII visited in 1539, along with Thomas Cromwell, & again in 1541. Edward VI was the next owner & it was refurbished. It was next owned by the then Princess Elizabeth who used it as a bolthole to avoid the court politics of her sister Mary. Following the Armada, the Lord High Admiral, Charles Baron Howard of Effingham, was given it as thanks for the victory.

We next come to the Civil War which is a very well documented story & too long to go into detail here. Donnington Castle was under siege following the First Battle of Newbury in 1643. The Royalist commander, Colonel John Boys, held the castle & prior to the siege had massive earthworks created around the castle – some of which are still visible today. The siege was not as one normally thinks of them. The Parliamentarians would turn up & have a skirmish but then leave to fight at another battle before returning to try again. They sent messages to Boys politely asking him to leave & he politely replied "No"! This went on for some time.

Cannon brought down the towers but the King arrived with his army for the Second Battle of Newbury but the Royalists realised they couldn't win & crept away in the night under the noses of the Parliamentarians. The King regrouped & returned as he had left the Crown & the Great Seal at the castle! Donnington Castle's siege was finally resolved in 1646. Boys had to surrender but the Royalists left with their munitions, flags flying & drums beating.

After that a lot of materials were stripped & it was left until after WW2 when it was found to be unsafe & was nearly demolished. However Inkpen Estate that owned it gave it to the Ministry of Works who made it safe & it is now in the hands of English Heritage.

The line opened 105yrs ago as the "Mid Hants Railway". Its main use was to take the farm produce to London. Watercress growing, which was a major industry, used the 11 o'clock train to take the crop to the city – so earning the line its aforementioned nickname.

The line is extremely steep at one point – sometimes requiring two engines to move the load – hence "Over the Alps".

Gradually the line began to be used less and in 1973 the line was closed but not forgotten. A preservation society was set up and it is still possible to step back in time for a gentle rail journey today. Lots of events are run during the year and Dr Peacock encouraged us all to visit.

Our next meeting will be flower arranging – perhaps with flowers from our own gardens! As I hoped our flower arranger Liz Castle did use flowers from our gardens and Super markets. She started by showing us what to buy a friend, and then continued with a table full of decorations using maximum greenery and minimum flowers, simple but beautiful. Aren't we lucky to have gardens!

The Clergy House, Highclere

Dear friends,

As some readers will know I arrived home on March 26th from 4 weeks in Uganda – having checked on the progress of a small education charity Sue and myself help to run. My time away was a welcome relief from the 'B' word! On arriving home I realised that, whilst passions and rhetoric over 'Brexit', are running high and we are in the midst of a serious situation, it could be far worse. In Uganda when there are public demonstrations, such as we've seen recently around the U.K., they would be met by tear gas, rubber bullets (and real ones), water cannon, armed riot police, and demonstrators being arrested, taken off to prison, injury, and even death. Meanwhile, locally where I stayed most people were doing their best to cope with the struggles of everyday life – hoping for rain so that newly planted seeds would produce their food for later this year; many walking a distance to collect safe water; others gueuing for hours to see a nurse or doctor at the local health centre; everyone walking or traveling on roads which don't deserve the name; and dozens of young people – many of them girls and orphans–coming to see me seeking some financial support so they could afford to go on a training course to gain a useful skill. These challenges, and many others, are faced by our fellow human beings with determination, dignity, and a beautiful smiling face!

It seems to me we can learn much from such people and the way they cope with so many difficulties – not least because it can help us to put things in to perspective in our current national crisis. Make no mistake – the people I met and work with in Uganda would swop places with you and me today!

At a time when our Archbishops are calling us to come together my prayer for our national life is that we become more thankful for the blessings of our lives, showing courtesy and respect towards everyone – especially towards those with whom we differ.



Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor

I read with interest the article in April 19 edition of Spectrum regarding IAM Advanced Driving course—an older driver that has questioned their competence and volunteered to attend and update themselves with a driving course with a view to making themselves a safer driver and to feel confident when driving with their grandchild, how fantastic. My own Uncle, still driving a car and riding a motor bike at age 100 years, volunteered himself for both bike and car driving assessment—you can catch up with him on the ITV series 100 Year Old Driving School—Jock Stares.

To add, as a nurse working in a local Memory Clinic, ability and safety to drive is a conversation I frequently have with patients and their relatives/carers. It is a legal requirement to inform the DVLA and insurance company of any health condition that may affect your ability to drive—this obligation applies to drivers of all ages. While health staff advise the onus is always on the driver and ignorance of the law is no defence. In particular with eyesight if you do not wear your prescribed glasses/contact lenses if required to drive you face immediate suspension of your licence and a fine of up to £1000 and penalty points or worse if someone is injured or killed. Memory issues/decline in cognition/dementia can affect driving ability and require the DVLA and insurance company to be informed. Also to note if you choose to drive after taking any prescribed medication that impairs your driving ability (drowsiness etc.) you are breaking the law.

St Thomas' Infant School

UGANDAN DAY

There has been a long tradition of a partnership between St Thomas' Infant School in Woolton Hill and the Bulera School in Uganda. Mrs Watson, one of our teachers, visited Uganda in 2017 to support teaching and learning, and others from the Woolton Hill community have also visited in the past. The emphasis is that both schools with diverse experiences learn from each other.

We wanted to share news with the community about a Uganda Day that was held at St Thomas' earlier this term to help our children understand some of the differences between the UK and Uganda.

The children arrived into school dressed in the colours of the Ugandan flag, black, yellow and red. The school was set up as an airport and the school hall as an aeroplane. The children, in roleplay, flew to Uganda on the special chartered flight from Heathrow to Kampala, the capital of Uganda. Before the children got on the plane all passports were checked and individual boarding passes were collected. During the mock flight the children learnt about Ugandan schools. Bulera School currently does not have any electricity and in the rainy season the classrooms are particularly dark. Thinking about a school with no computers, interactive whiteboards, photocopiers or telephones was particularly poignant for the children. Some of the children were taught with the lights off for part of a lesson so they could experience the problem first hand.

The children saw how all the toys at the school were made from waste, recycled materials or banana leaves. Resourcefulness is one of the personal qualities St Thomas' promotes and seeing what Ugandan children can do provided inspiration and challenged the norms of life.

The children also learnt about the importance of water and how children at Bulera School respect this important resource. Having one tap for the whole school challenged the children's thinking and the need to respect the resources we take for granted.

Over lunch a Ugandan menu was offered and thoroughly enjoyed by all. Finally, to end our insightful and thought-provoking day, the children took part in a carousel of activities including African drumming, dancing and art.



Our children in Key Stage One (6 and 7 year olds) will continue to learn about Uganda through the Learning Challenge curriculum covering topics including geography, art, music, reading and writing.


