#### **Book Reviews**

Our first meeting of the autumn session is traditionally a book review. The title we had selected from the NWR Big Read list for 2019 was If you can walk, you can dance by Marion Molteno. It is the story of Jennie a young (white) South African woman who from the best of motives unwittingly gets involved with a group of political activists who fall foul of the authorities. With her boyfriend Kevin, she is forced to flee across the border into Swaziland, cutting all ties with her home and family. The novel follows her journey to London and then back to various locations in Africa, exploring her deep love of the country and its people and the power of music to cut across barriers and cultures. Alongside this theme is the development of her complex relationship with Neil, an inspirational musician who fosters her musical passion. Reactions to the book were mixed, some feeling that it was too intense and rather 'heavy', but on the whole most people who had read it enjoyed it, while acknowledging that it was not a book they would normally have chosen. The meeting then moved on to discuss a wide variety of other books which had been read and appreciated over the summer, offering everyone plenty to get their teeth into over the upcoming long winter evenings.

#### **NHS Moral Maze**

Although the NHS today is very different from the NHS in1948, when it was first set up, it still aims to keep to the original principles of being free at the point of delivery to be based on clinical need and not ability to pay, and to meet the needs of the people. From research to advances in medicine and treatment, the march of technology has created a succession of moral dilemmas that earlier generations did not have to consider. Our general discussion covered some of the problems facing the NHS as it struggles with ever increasing demands for treatment, care and costs. The increase in obesity leading to type2 diabetes, drug and alcohol abuse, mental health issues and an ageing population. We acknowledged that life- style choices can have an influence on health and agreed people should be encouraged to take responsibility for their own health if that is a contributory factor to the cause of the illness. More education in schools on the value of diet and exercise with specific lessons teaching cooking of healthy enjoyable meals. Perhaps more coverage in the media like the 5 pieces of fruit/ veg which has had some success but needs reinforcing. We heard about one surgery that even funds sessions at a gymnasium to encourage patients to feel the benefit of regular exercise. We briefly commented on the role of NICE and the difficult problem of deciding which treatments the NHS should fund and as many of us had experienced the lack of communication between hospital departments and wasteful administration costs we felt changes were necessary but agreed we all have reasons to be thankful to the NHS.

# **Local History Society**

Our new season got off to an excellent start with an uplifting and heart-warming talk by Dr Becky Peacock from the Watercress Line about the London and South Western Servants Orphanage.

In the late 1800s railways were dangerous places and many men were killed leaving widows and orphans. Rev Canon Allen Edwards saw that support was needed and opened the first orphanage for girls in 1886 in Lambeth which became full within a year. It meant that mothers could work knowing their children were looked after.

It was set up as a charity and railway workers willingly set aside part of their wage to support it. The owners of the L&SW Railway did not initially wish to be involved as they didn't want to have extra bills to pay. This attitude changed over time especially as their wives became involved with the charity. However, the board was always mainly made up of railway workers.

In 1896 an orphanage for boys was set up in Clapham thanks to a £500 donation; again it was full within the year. Rev Edwards was concerned that London was not a healthy place for the children and in 1907 a new orphanage was built within seven acres of land purchased in Woking using another legacy of £2,900. It received royal approval as the foundation stone was laid by the Duchess of Albany, Queen Victoria's daughter in law.

This accommodated 150 children with plenty of room for expansion. A hospital wing and gymnasium were added. It was right next to the railway so the children were constantly reminded who was supporting them as they saw the railway men pass by. It was run as near to a family home as possible. The children attended local schools and got involved with the local community and could always visit their families. They were prepared for work prior to leaving with the boys going into railway work with 'no questions asked' and the girls into domestic service. Even after they left, they remained in contact especially if they fell on hard times. It really was a caring family. Once the social welfare improved there was less need for the orphanage but care for the elderly was now needed and the charity continues today as a care home. There was so much more information that I can't fit into this report but it lived up to Becky's title of "It's all about the family on the railway".

#### **EWPC News.**

It will not have gone unnoticed that summer has ended and we are into the season of mellow fruitfulness. As sure as the nights are getting longer the leaves will soon start falling. This is therefore a timely point to remind everyone that ditches and drains on your property should be kept clear of debris in order to prevent the flooding of your or your neighbours property. Regular checking and clearance over the next 2 months should keep problems at bay. I am pleased to report that the Neighbourhood Plan team have progressed enormously with what is actually a huge task for a group of volunteers. The public survey input for this project was conducted in 2014/15 and forms the basis of the plan. Having read through the current draft I realise what an enormous amount of work has gone into this. Frequent contact with B&D council for guidance and the use of external consultants has produced a polished and professional plan. Early in the new year the team expect to

begin public consultation events and

ultimately the plan will be voted on in

a public referendum and if accepted by the public it becomes

a legal document which has to be considered by future planners. It must be emphasised that adoption of a Neighbourhood Plan is not a mechanism to stop development but rather to manage development in the best interests of the community. Like it or not there will always be development. Over the next few months more information on the progress will be presented in Spectrum and on the Parish Council website. Watch this space!

New councillor. The council is pleased to announce the co-opting of a further councillor to join the team. This almost brings us to full strength as a council but we have room for another volunteer so don't tear up your application form yet! Our new man is John Morris. More details to come later but it means our council is comprised mainly of men, surely there are some ladies in the community who can spare a little time for the Parish Council.

# The First World War In East Woodhay In Memoriam

Ongoing research has now uncovered information on most of our previously unknown war dead and we remember them here:

#### Sapper Henry George Berry, Royal Engineers.

Died of lung cancer on 23 December 1919 and buried in St Thomas' churchyard.

#### Rifleman Frank Ernest Carter, 85th Btn., Canadian Infantry.

Emigrated in 1913. Brother of Walter Carter.

Killed in action 25 October 1918 and buried at Denanin Communal Cemetery, France.

#### Corporal William Gale MM, Royal Field Artillery.

Brother of Arthur Gale.

Died of wounds on 21 March 1920 in Neath hospital and buried in Neath being his wife's home.

#### Private Frank Jerrum, Lancashire Fusiliers.

Died on 18 November 1918 whilst a Prisoner of War and buried in Niederzwehren Cemetery, Germany.

Only one of war memorial names remains a mystery: **William Johnson.** We have not discovered anything about his military career, death or link to the parish. We will continue to search.

The memorial books in St Thomas' and St Martin's have been updated.

# **Gardeners' Club**

Our new season began with Rosy Hardy's talk on Autumn Perennials. A 24-time Chelsea Gold Medal winner, she is an well known expert on specialist hardy perennials, and her nursery at Freefolk is well worth a visit. As she mentioned, it is a windy site but has the advantage of close proximity to the Bombay Sapphire Distillery, so make time to visit both!



Much of her talk concerned the renaming of plants, with the first example being what most of us know as Michaelmas daisies. These are now divided into 11 groups. Worth remembering that the single flower Aster fricatii doesn't get mildew, while the Nova belgiae group suffer from mildew if under stress.

There was plenty of advice on siting and grouping plants and it was altogether a most informative evening.

On Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> November we welcome back Kelvin Mason, whose subject this time is Herb cultivation and their uses.

New members and guest are always welcome at our Hall meetings. Talks start at 8pm.

# Village Market

#### **Still Going Strong After Ten Years**

The village gathered on Saturday to celebrate ten years of our village market. The first event, held in September 2009, came about after a village survey voted for a market to showcase local produce and arts and crafts. Teresa Munn and Sandie Bishopp took up the challenge and set it up from scratch, bringing together stallholders, local charities and good causes.

Ten years on, the Village Hall was packed with stalls selling great produce, including local meat, eggs, seasonal fruit and veg, organic bread, as well as fresh Devon fish. Crafts, such as willow garden art, bunting and ironwork were also on show.

Since its inception, the Woolton Hill market has raised well over £10,000 for local charities and good causes, through the hire of the Tea Room and the sale of groceries, eggs and freshly-cooked bacon rolls.

Celebrating the special occasion, there were glasses of complimentary fizz, a chance to win £75 to spend at the December market, and for the younger ones, a themed Treasure Hunt, with a prize draw to win a family ticket for the local cinema. Committee members from across the ten years met up to share memories of running the event and to enjoy a slice of delicious birthday cake, kindly made by a friend of the market.

Dear Friends,

22

We are only a year on from commemorating the centenary of the Armistice which marked the close of the First World War, and now we have begun the 80th anniversary commemoration of the start of the Second World War. It is incredible to me to think that just less than twenty years separated these two dreadful wars. My father, who died some 22 years ago, would have been 100 years old this year. He was born just following the First War and was 20 years old therefore when the Second World War began. His poor eyesight meant he was of a "lower medical category" and so he joined the Royal Army Pay Corps. He was stationed for much of the war in Cairo and was involved in the exchange of currencies necessary as troops passed through travelling from one country to another. He did have a few hair-raising stories of adventures experienced when taking an accumulated amount of currency back to the country to which it belonged... the evidence of this being an album of small black and white square photographs of him standing in front of (or climbing!) various middle-eastern places of historic interest! I have his medals in my keeping. For my father the war, whilst dreadful, did not hold guite all the dangers, or horrors, that others experienced. This was not quite so true for some other older members of my family.

I imagine all of our families hold some memories at least of war time years past and sadly still present. So it is perhaps with a heavy heart that we approach the season of Remembrance again, with more commemorations and reminders that even after all these horrors humankind still struggles to live in peace and our armed forces still experience daily dangers. It seems to me that it is as important as ever that we continue to wear our poppies and gather for remembrance in November. As we pay our respects and honour those who died or have been injured in service of their country – let us also be always mindful that peace begins first with each of us. Let the words of St Paul stay with each of us this month "...if it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all" (Romans 12:18)







#### **Environmental Concerns**

#### A quietly cautious personal view from Phil Jarvis

Climate change and pollution of various sorts are presented in an apocalyptic alarming way resulting in demands to "do something" quickly. However the climate has always changed and for the last 10000 years has been warming and ice has been melting back. The North Sea was a grassy plain before melting ice flooded it.

When considering theories presented as fact, "follow the money" is a sound principle. Much of the scientific community now depend on funds poured into climate studies for their living so there is a vested interest in promoting the alarmist viewpoint which distorts facts. Add in the industries with "green" solutions to our "problems" which always need our taxes to make them work but still pay millions to the company bosses who invest our money. None of the awful events forecast by the climate alarmists over the last 40 years has come to pass.

The world has always had problems and as the population increases so do problems. De-forestation is a problem but is a solution to some who need space to grow food so how do we judge this.

I have been trying to buy only local foods to avoid the long distance freight but I fear I may just be depriving some poor peasant in a less fortunate part of the world from earning a living. If we use less packaging for food the wastage will increase through spoilage. Can that really be a good thing?

The oceanic pollution is our fault. We could have used this plastics-rich stream of waste as fuel in heat and power units (as in Scandinavia) which would have reduced the demand for fresh oil/gas to burn but "ecological" groups lobbied against this.

We don't have a climate emergency and the planet is doing fine. Whether the human species survive or not is in our collective hands but I seriously doubt that driving electric cars or avoiding plastic bags will have any effect. Population control might but that, as they say, is a whole new can of worms.


