

Well the first month of the New Year has now largely passed and although winter will last a while yet, the days are slowly lenathenina.

New Year cleaning

Spring cleaning is not something that springs to mind in February but the winter months are usually quite hard on our road signs. We would like to suggest that parishioners follow the example, set by our clerk last year, and scrub a nearby road sign to rid it of the inevitable growth of green mildew and dirt. All you need is a bucket of water and a brush to make a huge difference.

While on the cleaning theme, if you're lucky enough to have a pavement outside your house, sweeping it clear of stones, fallen twigs, leaves and anything else that appears will not only enhance the neighbourhood appearance but will add to the safety and comfort of any pedestrians using the path. Ditches may have clogged up since our

last reminder so check to see if you have any that need clearing.

Safetv on the roads We urge anyone walking with or

without dogs or



jogging at twilight or later to wear some form of high visibility clothing. Despite bright headlamps it is often very difficult to see pedestrian traffic when driving. Drivers have to contend with powerful headlamps coming the other way and this greatly reduces the sensitivity of the eyes and a pedestrian clad in black clothing can easily be missed (or hit in extreme cases).

Luckily cyclists are less guilty nowadays as they have learned that conspicuity pays off in safety. There are the exceptions of course and ultimately Darwinian theory deals with them, alas leaving bereaved families.

Any problems with footpaths should be reported to Basingstoke & Deane Council, while potholes need reporting to Hampshire County Council.



Local Mums In Business Group Celebrates One Year Anniversary

Laura Maton, who lives in Woolton Hill, is celebrating a year of success for a business networking group she runs for mums in Newbury.

Mums in Business Association is an international group. However, in 2019 Laura realised the opportunity the group could bring for local mothers and jumped at the chance to bring the concept to Newbury.

After graduating from Nottingham University with a degree in French and History, Laura came back to her home town of Newbury with her partner, Andy (a trained chef). They followed their dream of running The Bull Pub in Stanford Dingley where Laura managed front of house while Andy served up delicious dishes.

However, after having two boys (now 5 and 2), Laura and her partner said goodbye to their landlord days and set up home in Greenacres, Woolton Hill.



Laura's career took a new path and she launched a money-saving venture. Her business helps home owners and companies save on their utility bills and everyday spending.

While setting up the new business, Laura soon realised how effective and valuable networking events were for small business owners. However, with two young children at home she found it hard to attend them.

It was during this time Laura discovered Mums in Business Association, a group for mums and women who run their own companies. 

Dear Friends,

When did you first notice Easter eggs on sale in the shops this year? Someone told me they saw them before Christmas – well, I didn't see that! I did however see Cadbury's Cream Eggs for sale in the supermarket on 3 January. So, within the twelve days of Christmas when the figure of baby Jesus was lying safely in our Christmas crib, Easter has come into view!

I make no apology for mentioning both Christmas and Easter in the same sentence, because that is exactly what we shall be doing in our church services on Sunday 2 February. We will be celebrating the festival called Candlemas, also known as 'the Presentation of the Christ child in the Temple'. It falls 40 days after Christmas and looks back to Christ's birth and also forward to hint at the time of his suffering and death still to come.

On this particular festival we hear how Mary and Joseph took the baby Jesus, only 8 days old, to the Jerusalem temple to fulfil the rites of the law. Simeon, a devout old man, is there waiting, hoping, looking for the sign of God's salvation.

Somehow Simeon perceives that the child Jesus is the promise of God fulfilled, the one who will be 'a light to lighten all peoples'. In time past the year's supply of candles for the church were blessed on this Sunday – a reminder of Simeon's words about Jesus, the light for all people. Yet as Simeon meets Christ he sees both joy and sorrow: joy that the light shines in the darkness and joy in the promise of salvation; but sorrow at the cost of that salvation for Jesus, and for Mary as he says also to her 'and a sword will pierce your own soul too'.

In our communities I meet many folk who give a great deal of themselves to care for others, often unseen or in the background they attend to those in need. It can be a painful process to share the sorrows of others, to weep with those who weep is not easy and the darkness may seem impenetrable at times-but in that sharing of our love and concern, and our empathy with the pain of others, so I believe our communities are strengthened and something of the love and light of God are made very real.

May the light of Christ be with us all. With every blessing, Canon Christine



Training for a Half Marathon in 2020?

I (Abbie) ran the Reading Half Marathon in 2019. It was a first for me. The training wasn't easy, especially with two young children, but the buzz I got from crossing the finish line was amazing.

This year I've entered the half marathon again. A good friend of mine sadly lost her sister-in-law to cancer in 2019 and asked me to join her in the challenge to raise money for Cancer Research UK. Of course, I said yes!

I've started my training. You might see me running around the villages from time to time. However, as I know other Spectrum readers may have their own running challenges this year, I thought I'd ask a local Personal Trainer to give us tips to achieve our goal.

Andrew Hawthorn, who grew up in Woolton Hill, is a Personal Trainer, Boxing Instructor and University student. Also a regular half-marathon runner, Andrew shares his invaluable tips.

Steady does it

It can be tempting to jump straight into your long runs; however, this can lead to boredom and unwelcome injuries. Aim to set yourself weekly goals with gradual increases in distance. For example, Monday – walk/run, Wednesday – medium/ fast-paced jog, and Friday – long, steady run. Try to incorporate some weight-based exercises as well such as squats, lunges, push-ups and planks. Gradual increases ensure you safely adapt to your running, and weight training strengthens your muscles and joints, improving your endurance.

Nutrition

A highly important aspect of any training routine. Pre-training – opt for carbohydrates such as oats or try peanut butter and banana on wholemeal toast for a super energy boost! It's also very important to stay hydrated. Water is usually adequate for shorter runs, but once you start going over the one-hour limit – you may want to try a sports drink. For a basic recipe, mix 500ml water, 500ml unsweetened fruit juice, and add ¼ teaspoon of sea salt. Post-training – simple, sugary carbs such as fruit will help replace your energy levels.

Mindset

There will be times when you feel deflated; maybe you feel like you're losing, not gaining results. This is perfectly natural. When you feel sluggish – don't give in. You need to reward yourself for how far you've come and what you're going to achieve. A half marathon is not easy – it takes discipline – so pat yourself on the back and keep moving forward. You'll be amazed at how quickly your 'zing' comes back!

Gear

Wearing the right gear is essential for a comfortable race; for example, trainers, shorts and a top that helps keep you cool. If you're unsure what trainers to buy – professional advice is available in many (running) shoe stores. There is also a simple test found online known as the "wet footprint test". This offers a general guideline to help you choose your optimal shoes.

Rest

It's best not to try and run every day. Aim for at least one day of rest between training; if you get itchy feet – maybe go for a swim. Just remember: your body needs to recover to get faster and stronger!
