From the archives, May 1942

Rest Centre:

The Church Hall and the School are being equipped as a Rest Centre. Refugees will be sent to the village from badly bombed areas, and we shall care for them until they can be accommodated in billets. They will be given one cooked meal at mid-day and hot drinks at other times with sandwiches, etc. It is necessary to have a large team of helpers, and we hope to arrange for each to stay at the Hall for four hours at a time. We shall need helpers to prepare vegetables, cut bread and butter, wash up, and supervise the buildings during the night. If you can help in any way, at any time, please give your name to Mrs.Aird, Mrs.Uzielli, Mrs.Trier, or Miss Franklin.

The Red Cross Working Party has had a holiday, but once more it is "All hands on deck". The great call is now for knitting. This may seem peculiar as the warm weather (we hope!) is approaching, but don't forget two very important points (1) that it is never too hot in a trench and (2) that England has now to depend on her own knitting for herself and for her allies, as America cannot supply us any longer as she has her own men to look after. So knitters are urgently wanted to enable us to build up a good reserve. If you can help us please write to Mrs.Hunter, of Elm Farm, Woolton Hill, or else call and see us at the Church Hall any Friday afternoon from 2 till 4p.m.

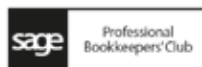

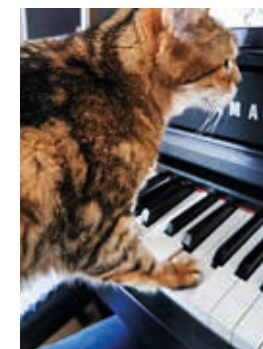

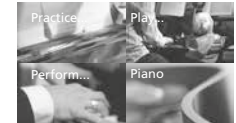

Collectively we seem to have coped with the shock of the changes and made the adjustments prescribed by the government such that things now seem to be running quite smoothly. Volunteer groups to assist the needy have sprung up everywhere and information on all our local initiatives can be found on the websites of the East Woodhay Society and the East Woodhay Parish council. Well done to all concerned.

How has your council coped? The EWPC has taken steps to ensure that council business can continue in the absence of a full council. Council meetings have been suspended until further notice but we have successfully held a full meeting by video conference and while the present ban on association remains we will continue with this format. It is possible for members of the public to observe these virtual meetings and details of how to do this will be available from the Parish Clerk.

The planning sub-committee will read applications and consult with each other remotely but we are expecting few new applications and the B&D planning

committee is effectively suspended pro-tem so very little activity is expected.

As you will have realised all playgrounds have been closed but footpaths remain open at the time of writing. It is generally possible to maintain the required separation although the boardwalk between Trade street and Fullers Lane is not wide enough for people to pass without breaching the separation requirement so we ask that you refrain from using this path where possible.

The defibrillator outside the Rampant Cat is now fully operational and we hope that you never need it.

Bin collections so far remain unchanged except that garden waste collection is suspended and there is a possibility that recycling will have to stop temporarily if the waste operators run short of staff. This has happened elsewhere so be prepared for this.

In the last issue our long serving Ward Councillor, Clive Sanders announced his departure but alas for him, with the cancellation of the elections due this year he remains in post for an additional year.

This number replaces the 3 numbers that have been publicised hitherto. It will put callers through to one of our friendly Coordinators who will help with arranging:

- deliveries of prescriptions,
- shopping
- other matters of concern during the current crisis.

This is in addition to our core service of arranging transport for patients to medical appointments.

The number will be manned from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday and there will be a voicemail facility outside those hours. This voicemail facility will be picked up as soon as a coordinator is available.

It should be noted that we are not able to arrange the delivery of prescriptions until the Surgery has confirmed to you that the medication is ready for collection.

We are aware that local news is changing all the time e.g. shop deliveries, opening times, events and other useful information. Consequently, we are sending out via email a regular weekly newsletter which contains the up-to-date news. If you do not already receive this then you can sign up via the link on the website:

What have we done?

At the time of writing in early April:

- Delivered around 3000 flyers across the area
- Delivered over 400 prescriptions
- Started delivering shopping
- Started calling people who are known to be in need of social contact
- Issued weekly newsletters
- Held an Easter competition for children

This could not have been done without the wonderful commitment of over 150 people who have volunteered with us.

A Personal Story:

As I write this, on the 7th April, the sun is shining and it is almost possible, by standing outside and breathing in the smells of Spring, to forget these extremely difficult and worrying times we live in. And yet here we are; week three of #stayathome and none the wiser as to when our lives will return to their normal states.

In our local area, spanning three Parishes but serving a much wider population, Neighbourcare has sprung into action, with volunteers in excess of 100 offering their assistance to those amongst us who are unable to get to their local surgery, or who are self-isolating and vulnerable. It has been a pleasure to be involved with such a well-run organisation which has, as you will no doubt realise, had to adapt very quickly to the changing and challenging circumstances.

I joined as a volunteer in March and was asked to pick up prescriptions for delivery within days. Admittedly, driving around in my car with my music on, no one to ask me how to work out a maths ratio question or what time lunch is (again), has been a joy. But the real pleasure has come from hearing those small taps at the window and a curtain pulled back, revealing a grateful face and a thumbs up as I leave a prescription on the doorstep. Or from an elderly person living in real isolation out in the sticks, no one else to see for perhaps months, who smiles and thanks me as I deliver what they need.

We have so much that is good in our community, and Neighbourcare is a shining example of what can be done in the most challenging of times. I would like to say a huge well done to the Neighbourcare team for pulling together the volunteers so quickly; it is a pleasure to be able to help, in some small way, those that need this valuable service.

St.Thomas' Churchyard

Last summer we arranged a quote (subsequently approved by the Parochial Church Council) for work in the lower churchyard to improve drainage and provide a safe path for pall bearers and for anyone wishing to visit graves. Given the time it takes to post the necessary public notices and to then receive permission from Winchester Diocese, it became obvious that this work could not be carried out before the ground became too wet in the autumn. However, we had been able to organise clearance of the ditch which runs from the bottom of the churchyard and through the recreation ground, in co-operation with the Parish Council, and this did have a beneficial effect.

As you will recall, the torrential rain early this year created huge drainage problems throughout our area and unfortunately the churchyard was inundated. The ground was sodden and slippery, and we do apologise to all concerned.

I hope that it was only the Churchwarden who ended up on her back in the mud!

During this time of lockdown we have not been idle. Planning permission has been granted, subject to conditions including an arboricultural report. Unfortunately lockdown will now delay us, as the Diocesan public notice cannot be displayed for the necessary 28 days while the public are not allowed to venture out to see it! Rest assured that as soon as this is lifted we will do everything we can to get the work done before the winter rains arrive once more.

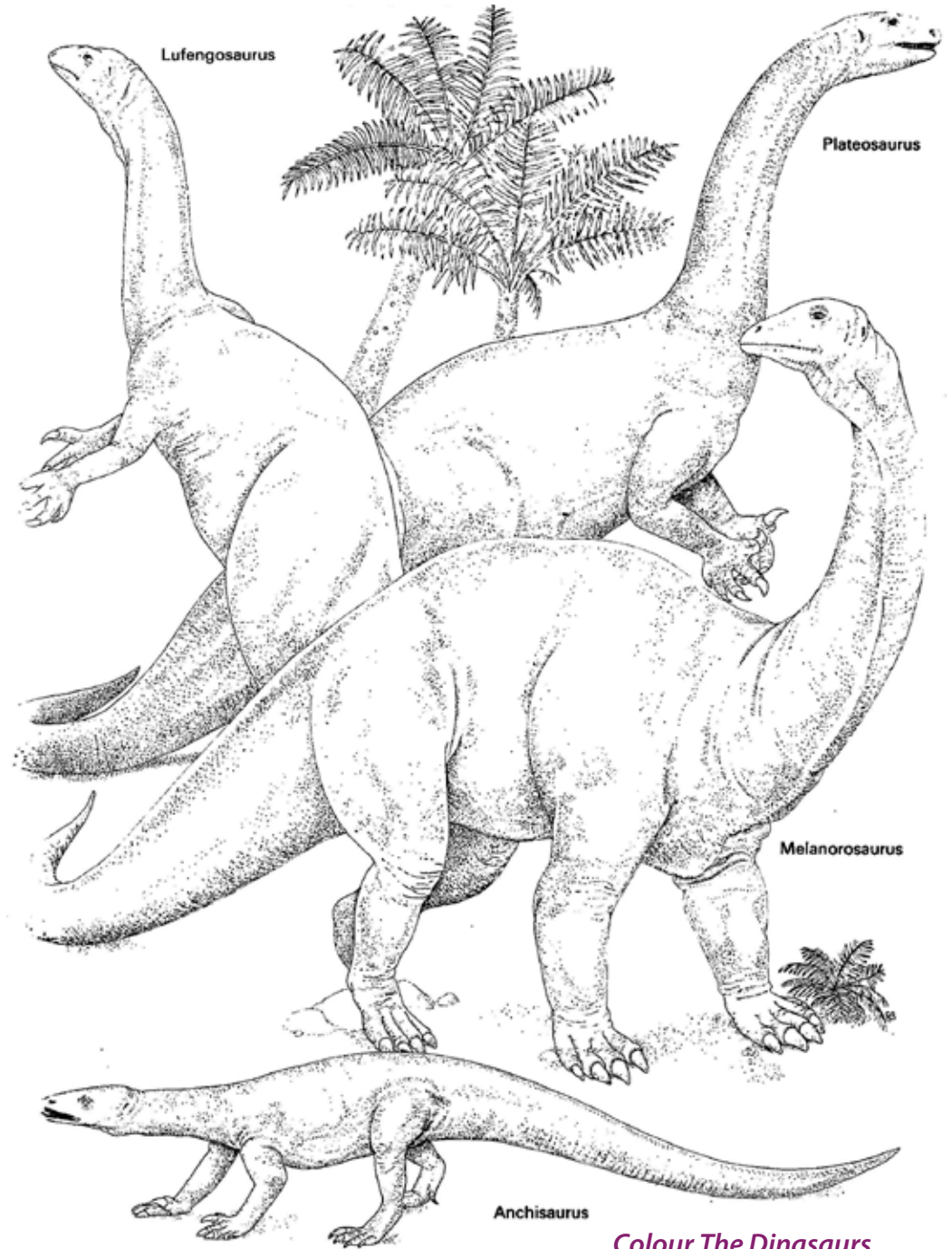

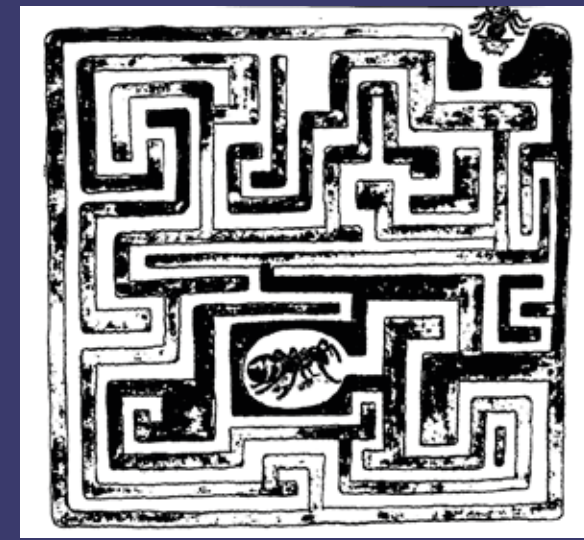

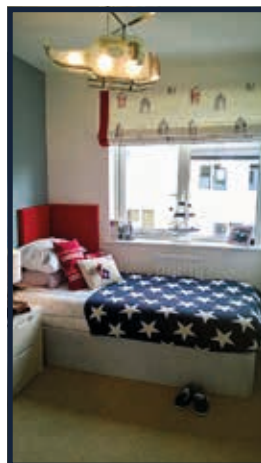

NWR



Finland (Suomi in Finnish) is the chosen country for NWR for 2020. The population is 5.5M and Helsinki is the capital. It neighbours Russia to the east and Sweden to the west, with the Gulf of Finland separating it from Estonia. It is generally flat with rolling plains, low hills, numerous lakes and 70% covered in forest. With a cold climate, well below freezing and largely dark in winter, it has a short but warm summer and can be light for 24 hours. Finland has a varied history – belonging first to Sweden and then Russia, finally becoming independent in 1917.

In WW2, Finland was never occupied but supported Nazi Germany. Finland now has an independent democratic

government, with the world's youngest prime minister, Sanna Marin (34) who heads a coalition government of 5 parties. The national pastime is Sauna and the national sport, Ice Hockey. It is also famous for some unusual World Championships: Sauna; Mobile Phone Throwing; Air Guitar and Wife Carrying. Dominant foods are boiled potato and cabbage, reindeer, rye bread and the unusual salty liquorish (Salmiakku).

Joy underpins the children's education, with play being very important and reading not taught until the age of seven. We had all heard of Jean Sibelius, with his 'Finlandia' being almost the National Anthem, although heavy metal and traditional folk music are also popular. Some members have visited Finland and we watched a Lapland holiday video with reindeer sleigh rides, tobogganing, husky mushing and tandem skiing – lots of fun in loads of snow!

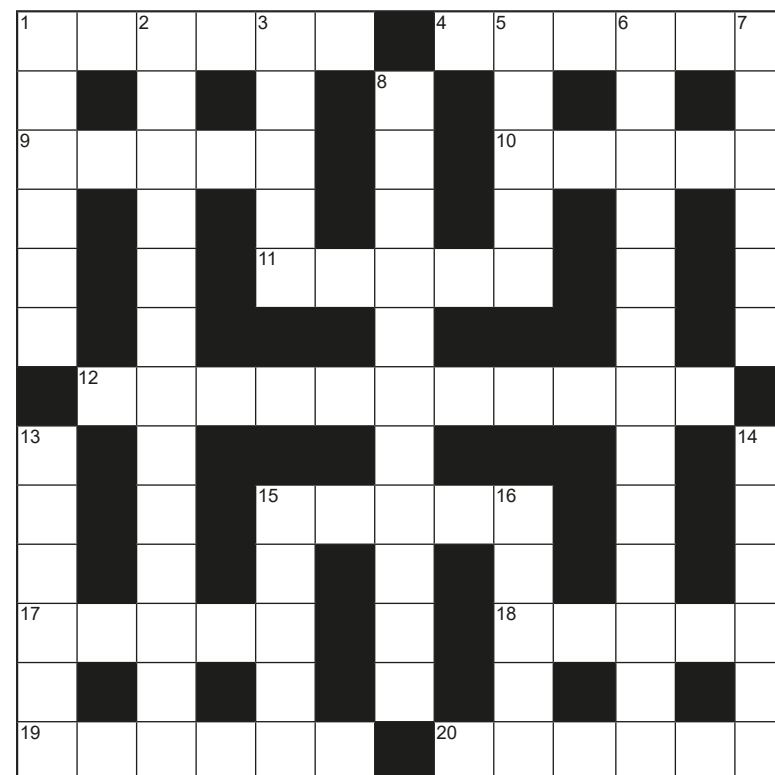

The committee sadly had to cancel the March meeting, and this will apply to the April meeting, as we are all being curtailed in what we can or mainly cannot do. So, I thought a few tips for you all to do in April would be most welcomed to keep you busy in the ever lengthening days, and the wondering what to do next syndrome. These are the RHS recommendations:

1. Keep weeds under control
2. Protect fruit blossoms from late frosts
3. If you have not done so already, tie in climbing and rambling roses
4. Sow hardy annuals, herbs, and wild flower seeds, outdoors
5. Start to feed citrus plants
6. Increase the water given to house plants
7. Feed shrubs and roses
8. Sow new lawn, or repair



- bare patches
9. Divide bamboos and waterlilies

There of course are many other jobs, which include keeping the lawns mown and edges neatly trimmed. I try to delegate quite a number of these jobs, but often fail. I shall be excitedly

examining my Potato Bags, and enjoy topping up the Ericaceous compost as my plants grow healthily upwards, into the warming skies.
