


Editorial

Woolton Hill & District Gardeners' Club

HE TONIC of having a Gardeners' Talk is rewarding, and through the medium of Zoom in

November, we were entertained by Geoff Hawkins, who has a wealth of knowledge in all matters gardening. He also has a secret passion for panto, when he plays the "Dame", albeit with a beard!

The subject was "Herbaceous Borders", and we were taken through a wide range of settings, in which plants can be set out as a waving sea of colour, height and style to suit any garden. Of course, the larger garden lends itself to laying out swathes of plants mixed in together, with

paths defining the planting, gates leading to other areas, and the introduction of different planting to break the immediate view, not to forget mirror images set out with a central path. Examples shown included Waterperry

Gardens, Monet's garden, Prairie Garden at Henfield, and many others.

However, all those of us with smaller plots were not forgotten, and he showed off the beautiful layout that he had developed for his suburban garden, which was small, and could be replicated by anyone. Tall plants mixed with short, clumps and repetitions, colour variety, the use of yellow, which always seems to bring itself forward, and blue in

the background. Geoff was not strict with types and encouraged interplanting of different plants, if that was what was wanted by the gardener.

Planting up in Groups, Tall, Blocks of Colour, Drifts of Green, and random planting were all encouraged to be experimented with. Plants in 3, 5 or 7 were recommended.

One of the great comments hidden within his talk was the fact that it was encouraged to leave the borders to die back naturally in the late autumn, so that the birds,

insects and other animals could enjoy harvesting the seed heads, etc. The gardener waits until early spring to begin tidying up, lifting and dividing, introducing new plants ready for the new year. Remember to match planting

with the soil type that you have.

Our club, thinking that it might well have lost out on our gatherings for talks, has found that Zoom talks have come to the rescue. When you read this, the next talk will be on 28th January '21.







East Woodhay Parish Council

WELL, ONCE AGAIN we prepare for a new year but pray it will be not as dire as the year just past.

It is worth looking back at where the spending of money generated from major developments has gone so I will summarise the major spend areas. This process is controlled by managers at B&D District Council and is not in the absolute gift of the Parish Council.

The EW Village Hall and the Woolton Hill Hall together had £93K spent on refurbishments.

Sports clubs: £23k spent of a total of £41k benefitting the following clubs: Bowls, Cricket, Football, Tennis.

Public Art, £10k spent by Bloor on a sculpture in Meadowbrook.

There remains £29k earmarked for the Woolton Hill recreation area subject to public consultation and £9k for the community land area at Meadowbrook.

The Parish Field

Following much misunderstanding circulating about the Parish Field and the path across it, the below statement should clarify this issue.

The path across the Parish Field provides an important route towards the surgery, to the Woolton Hill Schools, St Thomas Church, the Church Hall and walkers. The path enables a way of avoiding potentially dangerous roads.

Unfortunately, the existing trodden path is uneven and is therefore unable to be used by some with walking difficulties and as those, who have tried to use the path in winter and after the rain will know, the path is rarely in the state shown in

this photo when it becomes extremely muddy and therefore difficult to use.

Following feedback from residents, the PC has been investigating how to improve the surface. We have also been working to obtain a grant to help fund a porous, hard-surfaced footpath along the existing path line in accordance with HCC's Path Standards (2013). As the Parish Field is designated as being for agricultural usage, the Parish Council checked with B&D planners that planning permission was not required and the path does not change the agricultural designation.

We are therefore delighted that we have obtained approval for a grant from B&D Local Infrastructure Fund which will provide 50% of the cost of the path.



The Fittleworth sandstone path is designed to be firm but with a little give, be well drained and useable in all weathers; similar to that being used at many NT properties. It will be approximately 1.5m wide and to make sure we are providing a wheelchair and buggy useable route, the kissing gate at "Brownies Corner" will be replaced.

At the time of path laying we will take the opportunity to improve the drainage around "Brownies Corner" with a submerged drain between the two ditches.

Hopefully it will be installed in springtime 2021, when the field will be closed for construction. Once complete, the same conditions for the field will continue as exist now, i.e. all users going across the field must keep to the path and dogs kept on a lead.

The Parish Council are also looking to improve the biodiversity of the field as part of its long-term stewardship and, working with both B&D and HCC, commissioned a biodiversity study. We will update you further on the results of that study when it is received and next steps.





I hope you enjoyed this update and are looking forward to my next one.



Take a moment to breathe...

The growth and acceptance of mindfulness and meditation as an anecdote to our frenetic and unpredictable lives is testament enough to the powerful benefits it offers.

A definition for mindfulness meditation is:

Gentle awareness on an anchor such as breathing, to bring you in to the present moment, which in turn quietens the mind, relaxes the body and balances out difficult emotions".

New and more experienced meditators alike report immediate improvements. Benefits are cumulative, the more we meditate, the calmer and more relaxed we become. This means, the more regularly you meditate, or introduce mindfulness techniques to your life, the better the results for your health and wellbeing.

Benefits Of Mindful Meditation

Stress reduction

The most commonly reported benefit of mindfulness meditation is **stress reduction**. "Stress" occurs from within, but also bombards us externally from all angles. It's often quoted that it's not so much what happens to us in life, but rather it's how we feel about it, how we are with it, that matters.

Stress can be both good and bad for us. Good or healthy stress occurs, is managed and is released from mind and body. Bad or unhealthy stress is when stress stays with us. When we store stress hormones in our minds and bodies, it can be toxic. If we stay stuck in the stress cycle, stress may manifest as exhaustion, colds or flu, headaches, digestive issues or a skin problem, to name but a few.

Mindfulness meditation helps us become aware when we're holding on to stress and helps us develop a habit of recognising, acknowledging, and releasing it more regularly.

Improves sleep

Sleep is so essential, yet often elusive. One quarter of the UK population suffers from sleep problems, due to reasons including stress, medication, pain or tension, hormones, external disturbances or a particular symptom of illness or disease. If you can't sleep or wake too early or frequently, regular meditation can help.

Pain relief

Research continues into the potential for mindfulness and meditation for *pain relief*. While waiting for science to establish robust, peer-reviewed studies, many people report tension lifting and pain easing within a session or two. Techniques to improve flow and function in the body, to allow the body to completely let go of tension and relax, and improve breathing and posture are all contributory factors in managing pain in the body.

Top 3 Breathing Meditation Tips To Try

- To relieve stress, take a deep breath in through the nose and through pursed lips breath out the slowest, longest breath ever (helps hiccups too!). Repeat several times.
- 2. To sleep, count down from 100-0, counting on each exhale. Any time you wander off in thought, come back to the breath.
- 3. To relieve tension or pain, place your hand on that area (if possible or else bring your awareness to the area) and gently breathe in/out to the area of discomfort for at least 5 minutes.

Raising Money For Charity From Local Produce

What fun it would be to run a shop! My rather daunting Granny played shops with me on a dangerously small drop-leaf table, using her collection of Staffordshire figures and strings of beads as stock. Luckily the 5-yr-old shopkeeper had no idea of their value, apart from precious stock from which Granny chose. No money involved, but careful choices discussed and made. Useful lessons in life, taking care, reasoning, appreciation, persuasion, all painlessly absorbed.

First job, a holiday stint over Christmas in the toy department of our local big store. Later a few weeks' help for a grocer friend – paid in groceries. No wonder Harvest Festival in recent years found me below the pulpit in St Thomas' selling off the home produce when tins and dried good became less valuable than money paid direct to an appropriate charity.

2020, Covid-19 saw my daughter Claire working from home, and needing to keep her own mental well-being intact. She lives near a Community Orchard, so boxes of damson jam and crab-apple jelly kept finding their way to Trade Street until something had to be done. My sister's flat move expanded the stock available, so the Stanton Garden Room shop opened, once the first lock-down eased. Covid secure with access from the patio, sanitiser available and "donation" the price of everything. As stock decreased, the shop moved to a front room for window shopping with poster in the road to tempt walkers. Selected goods were put in the middle of the drive, with convenient donation box to hand.

The once small shop-keeper was happily able to play again, this time with paying customers, whose idea of the likely shop price for the goods on offer was both inaccurate and generous. The West Berkshire Food Bank was supported by all our 5 churches in the Benefice and an amazing £300 was the final total. Thank you.



Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor

In the December edition Spectrum, The Parish Council stated that there had been a great deal of misunderstanding.

I do not feel that there has been any misunderstanding regarding the proposed footpath across the Parish Field. I am still very much opposed to its construction.

The Parish Council did send me a specification which amounted to a few lines on an e-mail, with two unrelated photographs of paths in a woodland setting. Also attached was a sketch of a proposed cross section of the path.

I was expecting a specification that had been drawn up by a Chartered Civil Engineer. This would I feel sure have given details of not only the construction but the works to protect the existing grassland. It would also outline the degree of supervision, the insurance cover for both the designer and contractor together with any guarantee and ongoing maintenance programme.

It would be interesting to know who has tendered for these works especially as the published cost is £17k (or is this a one-horse race?). We must not forget that the monies are coming from the public purse and that the instigators of this proposal are accountable for their actions. They are duty-bound to gain the best possible deal should this unfortunate scheme go ahead.

It appears that no consideration has been given to the considerable amount of topsoil generated by this proposal. This is now a valuable commodity.

I remain concerned that the "design" does not take account of the known problems of springs and other water features in this area, and also of the retention of the paving to prevent the migration of the layers of construction into the adjoining soft ground.

Another concern is the ability for this construction to bear the load of agricultural plant to service the field, this especially having regard to the minimal depth of the construction and the amount of topsoil left in place under the pathway.
