### **Traffic Calming Measures Update**

In the June edition of Spectrum the Parish Council announced the implementation of "Speed Calming" measures throughout the Parish. This created a very positive response from many Parishioners who fully supported the initiative and shared the Council's concerns about the issue. Some also requested more information about the locations.

We have now agreed ten locations and the programme will commence in September/October. There will be one Speed Indicator sited in each location for a period of two weeks before moving onto the next. The areas which we have identified are Church Road, Trade Street, Woolton Hill Road, Tile Barn



Row, Ball Hill Road and Broadlayings. Some of these roads will have more than one location.

The first step in this programme is to build a picture of the "speeding problem" and then agree an appropriate solution. It is our intention to keep everyone informed through Spectrum as we build up more information. We would welcome any input as the scheme progresses and the identification of further "trouble spots" that you may feel that we have overlooked. *martin.hainge.ewpc@gmail.com*

### Wheat by Mike Robinson

### Give us this day our daily bread, crumpets, cakes and biscuits.

Wheat is one of the most widely produced crops around the world with about 800 million tons grown annually, derived from Emmer and Spelt wheats from Africa and the Middle East centuries ago.

Wheat breading programmes have developed a more widely used plant compared to oats, barley and rye. Compared with other plants such as maize and rice, wheat can be grown in a wider range of climate, soils and regions.

In the UK we produce about 18 million tons each year some of which is exported mostly to Europe and North Africa. Some will go to the Far East, but that will depend upon cheaper supplies from Russia, the Ukraine and the USA.

Wheat is classified in accordance to its quality and final use requirements. This is analysed within guidelines from the National Association of British & Irish Millers and assessed by a process known as The Chorley Wood Baking Programme. Wheat varieties are then divided into four groups:

- 1. The very best quality for bread making such that the dough is able to retain all the gases produced by the yeast in the bread making process. This produces a large long life loaf.
- 2. This group is also used for baking, but is of poorer quality. It can be blended with group one wheats, but produces bread of shorter shelf life used in the value product ranges which are cheaper to buy.
- 3. Biscuit wheats. These are not able or required to retain gases in the same way and therefore use to produce biscuits and flat breads.
- 4. Classified as feed wheats used mostly in animal production systems, ethanol, starch production and export.

On balance the UK climate allows for the production of high yielding group four wheats. The rainfall is not conducive in the production of best quality bread wheat which arrives mostly from the hot dry climate in Canada, USA and France. We import about 3 million tons for that reason. Specialist wheats are used for the production of pasta in Italy and rye biscuits are produced in Eastern Europe where again the climate is hotter and drier.



# Woolton Hill & District Gardeners' Club

### To Compost or Not to Compost?

I have noticed recently that within my small circle of family, friends and acquaintances, composting is a word that rarely crops up in conversation, if at all! I haven't heard the word mentioned at any Gardeners' Club meetings since I became a member three years ago, and even our guru, Monty Don, only mentions it briefly on very odd occasions!

"Why is this?" I ask, and you may reply, "Well, it's the thought of all those grass cuttings, clippings and veg peelings rotting away behind the bins!" But, once you have experienced the unfathomable joy of taking the side off the composter and discovering a rich, dark-coloured, earth-scented, soil-like substance, you will be a convert. Add it to your garden soil and over a few years you will no longer have the stony, dry, pale soil of North Hampshire and your plants will flourish.

People who compost fall into several categories: those who chuck it all in a heap at the end of the garden and hope for the best; some who build at least two, probably three, enormous open bins out of old pallets, which are rotated annually. Some brave souls go down the route of the 'wormery' or 'hot composter' with hundreds of 'brandling worms' doing all the work and others, like my husband Jon, opt for Hampshire County Council's 'Green Johanna', which is a green plastic bin into which you place layers of peelings and green waste, alternating with dry, brown waste, mainly cardboard and paper. I even have one friend who has a large rotating drum which is totally vermin-proof and is turned each day, into which ALL food waste can go! To really destroy weeds the composter has to reach at least 60 degrees centigrade and this is only achieved by the 'hot composter' or in a really ENORMOUS heap. I have seen the 'enormous heap' in action at the Botanic Gardens in Edinburgh where the heap was steaming as the various organisms got to work on breaking down the vegetation. Strangely, all of these methods work well eventually. Try one and see for yourself! If you need any helpful hints, please ask me.



However, a dodgy knee meant long distances were difficult. I had seen Nordic Walking several times when holidaying in Scandinavia so I googled it to find the Nordic Walking UK site which proved to be very informative.

Nordic Walking started as a summer exercise for cross country skiers and the NW poles are used differently to ordinary walking poles. The latter are used more in front of the body for stability though do still take a lot of strain off the knees. The NW poles are used slightly behind the body to help push you forward. This also exercises the upper body and core as well as helping the knees.

I found a group, Wessex Nordic Walking, based around Marlborough which does encompass Inkpen, Hungerford and Faccombe. I went on a course to learn the technique and got hooked so joined the Wessex group. I had some treatment on my knee and the pole walking helped strengthen the supporting muscles and I have no problems since, plus I have lost some weight. In 2020 I took up the Country Walking magazine's 'Walk 1000 miles' challenge and actually did over 1,250miles. I am repeating it this year and have already completed over 800 miles.

Obviously, most of this was done during the lockdowns when roads and lanes were deserted. I also went up on the Downs where it was quite surreal — no airplanes or vehicle noise, just bird song and insects buzzing. Wildlife was easier to see as it took advantage of the situation and I have seen groups of hares, roe deer, fallow deer, muntjac, stoats plus so many wildflowers and insects.

We are now back walking in groups and I travel over a lot of Wessex. As well as the wildlife, I have now visited many historic sites – Avebury, West Kennet Long Barrow, the Wansdyke, to name a few, plus many pretty villages. As the Marlborough Downs are not as wooded as ours, the views are breath taking. However, there are a few woods such as West Woods and Gopher Woods where the bluebells and wild garlic are amazing in the spring. There are walks of different lengths and difficulty plus you can walk with other groups around the country when you are away on holiday.

All in all, it was a great decision to take this up. My fellow walkers come from varied backgrounds and interests so the conversations are also fascinating. One more thing – we also find some wonderful cafes for the occasional 'treatlet' afterwards!!


