

East Woodhay Local History Society

Life in the Parish over the past 100 years

This is a belated report from last October's talk given by the society's chairman, Norman Powers.

Norman looked at life in the parish over a period of 100 years that coincided with the Women's Institute's first century.

The many photos that he has amassed showed the wider variety of activities that went on in the village such as Ball Hill Dairy, Blacksmiths and a holiday camp. Many more pubs were evident around the parish but now we are down to just two.

Charabanc coach trips were also a highlight at that time plus the local railway station that meant you could travel down to Winchester and Southampton or up to Newbury and Didcot. It was also essential for the many goods that were transported as well, such as Marsh's coal. How useful that would be now!

Some of the large houses were shown at the talk and many of their occupants were very good to the village. Sir Frederick Carden, who lived at Stargroves, was frequently the official opener of many events. Others gave parcels of land for parish use such as the cricket ground and the Parish field near St Thomas'.

Norman also told us about the various churches and chapels as well as St Martin's School and its earlier

history. One story was about one headteacher who had to go around North End with a wheelbarrow to get enough coal to heat the school. Educational funding issues are not new!

More exceptional events were also covered such as the Heinkel that crashed in Fullers Lane during WW2. The tail is in a museum at Littlecote and a machine gun is still meant to be around somewhere in the village.

It proved very interesting to compare the parts of the village shown on the screen with how they are now. That led to a short discussion on road names which have changed or disappeared over the years.

We must be very grateful to Norman for collecting all this information and if anyone has any old photos or documents that could add to that collection then we would love to hear from you.

Before Covid-19 the Society was starting to organise a permanent archive at the Village Hall but, obviously, that has been put on hold but will be something we will return to soon. The Society did produce a book in 2000 on the history of the parish and copies are still available, priced £5. Please contact me on:



Dear friends,

I am writing this letter before we even begin December but hopeful that in spite of great concern over COVID cases, and news of another variant of the virus being a threat, our Christmas church services, gatherings, and celebrations will have taken place; and we will have had an enjoyable Festive Season hoping that all of us will be more aware of the real 'reason for this season'!

Writing a January letter for our local magazine so far ahead is potentially fraught with difficulties and so I wrestled with the question "where can I find some inspiration so as to avoid falling into the trap of resorting to vacuous New Year platitudes?" The answer came in a four-letter word which I recalled reading on a Border Regiment Chapel memorial in a Cumbrian parish church during our August holiday in the Lake District – HOPE. According to writer Alexander Pope: "Hope springs eternal in the human breast".

Author John C Maxwell noted that "Where there is no hope for the future there is no power in the present". Experience teaches me that without hope there is despair, without hope it is very hard, if not impossible, to see a way forward.

By any review of 2021 it was a challenging year for everyone. But there were some signs of hope. In meeting the challenge of COVID now and in the future, global cooperation in the production of vaccines is proving to be a vital key to our learning to live with Coronavirus just as we live with other respiratory illnesses. Some people are choosing to remain unvaccinated which can lead to others becoming very ill; our son tells us that some people on London public transport are not following the requirement to wear a face-covering – so some people are being irresponsible and selfish – thankfully most people do care about others and have shown this over the past two years.

Our national economy seems to be recovering from the impact of several lockdowns – although inflation will badly affect many households. Following the gathering of world leaders for the COP 26 climate conference in Glasgow in November, there seems to be a growing awareness that determined international cooperation is the only way to tackle the problems posed by global warming. There are, as we all know, many challenges to be faced in our country and across our world, but, by and large, the response to the pandemic has shown that when we realise our common humanity, combine that with a choice to view our differences as enriching, cooperate rather than be divisive and work together for the common good and the flourishing of everyone, then there is hope!

To all readers and local people my hope is for everyone to have a Happy New Year!





Medical breakthroughs since the 17th century

ur first topic in November was Medical Breakthroughs of which there have been many over the centuries.

William Harvey was our first pioneer. In the early 17th century he discovered the circulation of the blood and worked out that it flowed from the heart to the lungs via arteries and veins.

Between the 1700s and 1900s a vaccine to eradicate smallpox was discovered, anaesthesia was developing apace leading to the manufacture of chloroform (imagine basic dentistry or surgery without it!) and scientists found that specialist cells in the pancreas secrete insulin which regulates blood sugars. We now have synthetic insulin.



In 1900 Paul Ehrlich's work on pathogens led to the discovery of two drugs active against syphilis. This was a common and devastating disease of that era. He coined the term 'chemotherapy' and developed drugs which killed the pathogens and not the patient.

The bacteriologist Alexander Fleming identified a mould belonging to the genus Penicillium. Collaboration by scientists and the industry resulted in the widespread manufacture of penicillin by the 1940s.

World War II was a catalyst for many scientific breakthroughs. Plastic surgery and treatment for burns victims was revolutionised.

By the 1960s transplantation of organs and tissue and kidney dialysis were becoming regular medical procedures. If a donor kidney is not available, dialysis is a life saver.

The contraceptive pill was also becoming widely available. To date, cochlear implants and tiny battery-powered hearing aids have come a long way from the simple but large ear trumpet.

Topically, just one downside of this progress is the carbon footprint of the NHS. This accounts for 5% of UK's greenhouse gases by inhalers, blister packs and some drugs. According to this article, it won't be long before some brilliant scientists have a solution.



St Martin's CE Primary School

St Martin's link with Bukuya

For a number of years, St Martin's has had strong links with a school in Uganda. This link exists through the Winchester Diocese, and involves all the primary schools in Whitchurch Deanery, including the Church of England schools and these are all linked with Church of Uganda schools in the Mityana Diocese of Uganda (about 60 miles west of Kampala).

The school that we are linked with, Bukuya School, sits on a ridge mainly surrounded by a swamp. The local town, Mityana, is about 1.5 hour's drive away. The majority of the pupils that attend the school walk at least one mile to school and back each day. Some of them make this journey with no shoes on. Their school year runs from February until early December, therefore following the calendar year.

At St Martin's we love to learn about our companion school and understand what life is like for the children of Bukuya. Rev Dodie visits regularly to keep us updated about life in Bukuya and takes our news back to Uganda when she visits. There are many ways in which we are similar, for example we all love to sing, play football, and learn! There are also many ways in which we are different, such as some subjects we learn, the food we eat and the environment in which we learn.

Each year at St Martin's we hold a Uganda day. This involves the children dressing in black, yellow, or red, the colours of the Ugandan flag, and spending the day learning about the children at Bukuya School.

We have been involved in many fundraising activities and have been able to provide substantial support to Bukuya School. In the past, some staff from our school have visited Bukuya School, and vice versa. This has not been possible in recent years, but we hope that one day it will be again.

During lockdown, Rev Dodie made some virtual worship sessions for us to watch at home and continue to learn about the school and the struggles they have been facing during the past 18 months. Currently the school is still shut so pupils have had no access to education for nearly two years.

As well as learning from each other, at St Martin's it's important to us to think about other people and to help and support them where we can. We recently raised £1,500 for a new block of four latrines for Bukuya, which have now been built and are being used, not just by the school, but also by the church and the local community.

The fundraising is important for the school but just as important is the communication between the two schools and the information passed from one to the other and the Bukuya church link with St Martin's.



Woolton Hill & District Gardeners' Club



Whilst walking with friends and family along the road through East End, I have often been impressed by the quality of the produce on the vegetable cart outside Sungrove Farm, as I am sure many of you have also been. So, the opportunity to hear about how this happens is one I was looking forward to,

especially as Mat was coming to the November meeting in person; our first speaker to do so since February 2020.



As Mat began speaking about the development of the garden at Malverleys, during the last ten years and about his previous position at Great Dixter, I began to realise that the role of a professional Head Gardener involves many disciplines – horticulturist, farmer, botanist, florist, carpenter, chef, teacher, and manager. For many of our members, these wide-ranging occupations are what keeps gardening fascinating!

Fruit and vegetables are grown inside the walled garden at Malverleys, as well as in the market garden at Sungrove Farm. The soil is kept

in tip-top condition by digging in well-rotted cow and sheep manure; many vegetables – brassicas (the cabbages and kales) and umbellifers (carrots, celeriac, parsnips and fennel) – are protected from pests with Enviromesh and seeds are given an early start using Jiffy pots, paper tubes and home-built cold frames. Carefully managed crop rotation also helps to keep the produce healthy and pest-free and, for those of us who grow our own food, the most important aspect of all – taste testing is given a high priority!



- Sow onion seeds on Christmas day for the largest prize-winning onions at East End Show.
- If your parsnips don't germinate, it will probably be the seeds!
- · Ask your supermarket why their lettuces do not have slugs in.
- Collecting your own seeds from summer squash could lead to a visit to the doctor the following summer!

Thank you Mat for a most interesting talk. We are all looking forward to the next Open Day and the return of the Veg Truck.


