I am no twitcher. I know my Robins from my Blue Tits and Red Kites from Buzzards but as I say I am no twitcher and when it comes to bird song I have very little idea as to what birds make which song but I do know when I hear something new.

My wife and I were walking in the chase in mid-April and heard a song that was very different from anything I had registered before. It was coming from about four meters away and even though it was so close it still took us a full five minutes to spot the source. A very dear recently departed friend of ours would have called it a LBJ (Little Brown Jobby). Certainly brown with lighter tummy and splodges of darker brown near the throat.

Out came the books when we got home and we thought it was a Nightingale and so we Googled bird song and this clinched it. It was exactly what we heard. My children tell me I could download an App to identify bird song but that is beyond my technical ability! The fact I managed to find it on Google was almost a miracle.

I have heard it many times since in exactly the same place and seen it on four other occasions so it is obviously territorial. A real treat and it is surprising what you can notice if you keep your ears and eyes open to the world around you.

Headteacher, Mrs Bartlett says "We are thrilled to be recognised for

the work we have done as a whole school community to raise awareness of the

extreme inequalities across our globe and perhaps more importantly, the steps we can take to address these."

We have a link with our companion school in Bukuva. Uganda. Children in both communities have shared letters and drawings and have enjoyed finding out about how life is lived in another part of the world. Learning from our friends in Bukuya has enriched our life as a school community. Recently we have shared a favourite song of ours with Bukuva and they are busy learning it! We hope to learn a Ugandan song soon too.

Any primary school in England can join the Global Neighbours scheme. There are three levels of accreditation: bronze, silver and gold. These are verified by Church of England Education Office assessors. who look for evidence across five areas: school leadership, teaching and learning; collective worship and spiritual development; pupil participation; and community engagement. www.st-martins.hants.sch.uk



Woolton Hill Sports Club



- 75 years old and still thriving!

s Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II celebrates her Platinum Jubilee. closer to home there is also cause for celebration as Woolton Hill Sport Club reaches its 75th Birthday.

In 1947, shortly after the end of the second World War, the village 'Welcome Home Committee' purchased land to be used specifically 'for the recreational and social benefit of the local community'. Fast forward three quarters of a century and, today, the LTA-affiliated Club more than fulfils those goals, offering facilities for both tennis and table tennis with a growing membership of nearly 300 individuals of all ages.

The original Clubhouse (complete with authentic 1940s verandah) now overlooks three, well-maintained floodlit tennis courts with table tennis played inside the building and the old squash court.

As a tennis player and Committee Member for over 20 years, Club Chairman, Carl Gorman, has seen the club thrive, "A key to our success is the friendly Club atmosphere – all standards and ages are welcome".

This is reflected by the fact that over 160 juniors are coached each week with ages ranging from 5 to 18 – roughly equal numbers of girls and boys. Professional LTA-accredited Club Coach, Mike Gordon, shares his strategy for a successful junior coaching programme, "It's simple really – positive encouragement and making it fun".

Social tennis for adults is also popular with a variety of ladies' and men's groups playing throughout the week, including mixed club nights. For those members who like to play more competitively, the Club enters men's, ladies' and mixed teams in the local and County leagues-currently fielding fourteen teams!

The table tennis section is an active and rapidly growing part of the club

with six teams competing in local leagues. This makes us the second largest Table Tennis Club in the area with a well-attended Club night every Monday evening.

Woolton Hill & District Gardeners' Club

In April Geoff Hawkins, Radio Presenter, Horticultural Judge and Pantomime Dame, spoke to us on the subject of 'Ground Cover'.

t may seem rather unusual and quirky to begin an article about Ground Cover', by delving into the subject of 'seeds', but it is these tiny structures of life that cause gardeners so much misery and joy simultaneously, which lead to the need for ground cover of various kinds. Seeds are incredibly durable, extremely tolerant of harsh conditions and can survive long periods of dormancy. Seed-bearing plants have developed myriad ways of sending their seeds out into the world - through explosion, attached to fur, carried on the wind, floating on water or ingested and expelled by animals. All of this means that seeds are in the soil everywhere waiting for the right conditions for germination. Unfortunately for garden lovers, many of these seeds are classed as annual weeds, just waiting for their moment to appear above ground. Unbeknown to us, the little seed is germinating, producing roots and shoots and taking all the goodness from our soil as early in the year as February! The only way to stop them is to create darkness above them, hence the need to cover the ground in any way possible.

For ease of maintenance, you cannot beat bark chippings for covering the ground and preventing most weeds from appearing and Geoff talked about this, even showing us one garden where the chippings had been stained different colours for effect! More unusual solutions are often found on allotments; the use of cardboard or newspaper, black plastic material through which vegetables are planted, sheep's wool insulation, dried grass cuttings and straw, as well as the more usual manure and compost, all of which are very effective weed suppressors.

As a plant-lover, my solutions to the problem of weeds are these: never dig the soil as it brings seeds to the surface: leave fallen leaves to cover the ground for as long as possible; and hoe out tiny weed seedlings as soon as they appear. But the best solution of all, as suggested by Geoff, is to plant as many low-growing plants as you can to suit conditions in your garden. Here are a few examples to get you started; Vinca minor 'Atropurpurea', Brunnera macrophylla 'Jack Frost', Bergenia cordifolia 'Winterglow', Dicentra Formosa 'Langtrees', Ajuga reptans 'Catlins Giant', Aquilegia 'Clementine Blue', Lamium maculatum 'White Nancy'. Galium odoratum and Alchemilla mollis. I expect you all have your own favourites as well! Lorna Rains

National Women's Register

Faced with the topic Your Favourite Place in the UK, we struggled to single out a particular favourite. We loved the sea and water, reminiscing about seaside resorts and coastal walks. East Anglia and Norfolk favourites included Cromer, with its traditional pier, and Wells-Nextthe-Sea with its Beach Huts: both having an 'old fashioned' feel and long beaches, as did Newgate in Pembrokeshire. Bamburgh Castle and Lindisfarne were admired for being spectacular and atmospheric. A coastal cottage in Devon near Totnes held happy memories, with the tidal river, hilly terrain, grazing animals and eccentric, friendly locals. In Cornwall, St Just has a 13th Century church set above the St Mawes estuary, a peaceful and spiritual place. Trebah, a sub-tropical garden with its own secluded beach. Gweek Seal Sanctuary and the Minack Theatre were also favourites.

Moving inland, Somerset conjured up childhood joys of climbing Brent Knoll and visiting nearby Cheddar Gorge. The Lake District National Park was loved for its scenery, mountains, lakes and walks. Lake Vyrnwy in Mid-Wales, a reservoir and nature reserve, created in the 1880's, is surrounded by mountains and forests. Bristol evoked fond recollections, with its friendly people, docks, Clifton Suspension bridge, and Balloon Festivals, while Oxford had its ancient colleges (back to 1260), plus the Ashmolean and Science Museum.

We all agreed that we also loved our homes and gardens and were always happy to return after our travels! Our second challenging theme in April was What would you be prepared to deny yourself for

prepared to deny yourself for the sake of the planet? Opening with 'it takes 21 days to form a habit'. perhaps the mantra Reduce. Reuse. Recycle could become new habits. We have already switched off the light when leaving a room, boiled the kettle with the required amount of water, reduced paper usage, rejected plastic, resisted flushing the loo every time. Suggestions such as giving up airflights and using a car with poor fuel consumption, eating less meat, walking or cycling instead of driving were considered do-able, though it was agreed that giving up the car altogether in a rural area was not.

Additional ideas included shunning products from China which is the most polluting country, growing more vegetables at home, switching off TVs, buying fewer clothes, reviewing investments by considering ethical and green funds. All this was before we raised the topic of electric cars.

Bigger initiatives have to be Government led, including a national scheme for recycling, clearer information on packaging, a self-sufficient economy. Lobbying the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs on these issues was proposed as a positive action.


