The Herb Garden

arly July is, without doubt, a time for the herb garden. Whether you have a formal potager design, a collection of pots beside the back door, a home-built contraption made from old pallets to hold tender herbs or herbs growing randomly in the border, they will all be looking their best.

Mint is growing strongly; lavender is in flower and sage has soft tender new leaves for picking. In the dry. sandy soil at our allotment, rosemary is the star performer. The dusty blue flowers have faded, and fresh green growth spikes upwards to the sun. This shrubby Mediterranean plant appears to grow about four or five centimetres each week and is now up to my chin. My arms hardly stretch around it, but when I try, the scent is glorious. The rosemary sits at the end of a border across the plot; sage next, underplanted with golden marjoram with a curry plant tucked in behind. Garlic chives send up their pretty white flowers and bronze fennel has seeded itself everywhere, and delightful though they all are, they appear insignificant beside an enormous angelica in its second year with great bulbous seed heads. I will cut these soon or the whole plot will be covered with baby angelica plants next year.



Now, on a sunny day, take a moment; with scissors, cut the stems and gather posies of herbs for family and friends: take a moment to breathe in their scent, taste a few little shoots and listen to the bees humming from flower to flower. And. when you have gathered your herbs, move on and take a whole nasturtium flower and put it in your mouth. The slightly spicy flavour and crisp texture is reminiscent of young rocket - a secret flavour which few people know. Edible flowers can take their place happily in a herb garden; violets, calendula, rose, bergamot and dandelion are all contenders. Well. maybe not dandelion!!

If you don't already grow herbs, have a go. Shrubs like rosemary and sage can be planted in early autumn, likewise perennials, such as mint, hyssop, chamomile and fennel. Chives will often keep growing through winter and some tender plants like flat-leaf parsley will survive a mild winter. Or plan for spring and choose a few annuals as a starting point. Tarragon and chervil, with parsley and chives are the French 'fines herbes' for an omelette, or basil placed next to a tomato plant ready for a salad with mozzarella. It is when you begin to combine herbs with other ingredients that their true flavours emerge, and you begin to understand why they give you so much iov.



Dear Friends.

I would like to say a huge thank you to Canon Marvin Bamforth who has just retired from his ministry as Associate Priest amongst us. He and Sue are now in the process of moving north to Morecambe, you may have read his letter about this in July's magazine. It has been a great pleasure for us to have Canon Marvin and Sue with us these last four years: sharing with us friendship, wisdom, kindness, spiritual insight, life experience and humour — with an anecdote or three involving cricket or Yorkshire! We will miss them both.

Canon Marvin may be leaving but the role of Associate Priest, sharing in priestly ministry with the Rector, continues. It is important to remember that these roles of Rector and Associate Priest are a constant and over time priests come and go. In our churches there are 'Rectors' boards which list the names of those who have served. Each priest has brought their own unique skills and talents, strengths and weaknesses and fulfilled the role in different ways. As we begin the recruitment for a new Associate Priest we know that whoever joins us will not be like Marvin, and nor should we expect them to be. He or she will bring other gifts and their own unique personality and stories and will enrich our shared life in a different way. This is right and good, for so ministry grows and develops, and we pray for God's guidance in finding the right person to join us in the next stage of our journey together.

Canon Marvin will probably not forgive me for mentioning his name in the same sentence as Prime Minister Boris Johnson, who has today (7th July) announced his resignation from leadership of the Conservative party, serving on as caretaker Prime Minister until a new leader is elected. We do well to remember that Prime Minister is another such role (albeit rather higher profile than our lowly clergy!) that has constancy and is bigger than the person who occupies it at any one time. As this change in our national life approaches those of us who pray, regardless of our political allegiance, should be active in praying for the integrity of the process, for those involved and for the person who will step into this most demanding and significant role at this particular point in time for our country.

May this scripture inform our prayers in time of change and remind us that there is always a bigger picture in which we all find our place:

'The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.' Proverbs 9:10

To mark the end of their time at St Martin's and to celebrate all of the children's successes, there are a number of special activities that have taken place in the run up to the end of the term.


