

> I had a crush on a boy at school And knew of his address. So sent a card and neatly wrote -"From who - you'll never guess."


This caused him much frustration Travelling home on the school bus; Asking girls "Did you send this?" And making guite a fuss.

# East Woodhay Local History Society

Sandleford Priory probably better known these days as St Gabriel's School



A notable later resident was Elizabeth Montagu, a leading member of the Bluestocking Society, who greatly extended and elaborated the property to how it looks today. She employed Robert Adam for some of the work and Capability Brown for the grounds. These grounds extended to the west of the current road that goes down to the Swan Inn where the proposed development will be.

The estate was owned by various other people after Elizabeth until, in 1948, St Gabriel's School moved there from its previous home at Ormonde House in Newbury.

Our February meeting will be on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> February at 8pm in the Village Hall, Heath End. This will be our AGM and short talks.

David Peacock came to speak to us in December on the subject of Sandleford Priory. This is probably better known these days as St Gabriel's School, south of Newbury College and Tesco. Although David had a lot of information, it is a site that could do with a lot more research both archeologically and via documents.

It started as a small church with a connection to our parish for a short while before becoming an Augustinian Priory. When it was abandoned, the estate came under the ownership of St George's Chapel, Windsor, who leased it to the Kingsmill family of Sydmonton Court. It was then, in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, that it was turned into a country house.

## Woolton Hill & District Gardeners' Club

### The Fabaceae Genus in Thailand

O ften, in Thailand, on arrival at a hotel or a celebration, one is offered a small glass of a blue or purple-coloured hot or cold drink with the most delicious flavour. This is butterfly pea flower juice which is made from the dried flowers of Clitoria ternatea, a slender tropical vine. The juice is renowned for its colour, its flavour and its health benefits. The plant contains anthocyanins which give the drink its colour and is said to have anti-inflammatory properties and a sedative effect, although this may just be the effect of consuming a warming or cooling drink! Lime juice is often added to the juice to change the colour to bright purple with a little honey added for sweetness.

The plant is an attractive herbaceous perennial which can be grown in any formal or domestic garden in tropical climates. The flowers attract butterflies, bees and other pollinating insects, hence the name 'butterfly pea' and are a vivid deep blue. The plant is a member of the Fabaceae or pea family and like other members of this family, has deep roots with the ability to fix nitrogen in the soil.

Another plant from the same family also found in Thailand, is Sesbania grandiflora, a tree which can reach 15 metres in height, and despite a very fast growth rate, is often kept smaller by pruning. The particular variety found in Thailand is a sun-loving perennial with a branching habit and slender mid-green edible leaves arranged in pairs along a stem. The flowers hang in clusters below each leaf stem and open quickly from bud to fully open within hours. Like other perennials in Thailand, leaves drop regularly throughout



the year and are replaced with new growth. This means that the leaves are always green. The cool season (our winter) is flowering time. Flowers can be a creamy-white, pink, purple or red and have a velvety texture.

To prepare the leaves and flowers for eating, simply pick early in the morning, chill until lunch time, then blanch in water for a few seconds and serve with a spicy sauce or nam phrik (chilli paste). The flavour is quite exquisite and the health benefits many; this plant contains biotin or Vitamin B7, good for skin, nails and hair and for helping in the recovery from inflammation and infection.

### St Martin's CE Primary School



he school library at St Martin's is an integral part of the school. It is a special place where all the children get to spend some time each week. We have two student librarians who help to keep the area organised and appealing to all pupils.

Each class has an opportunity to visit the library once a week to return the book they have borrowed and spend some time deciding on which book they would like to read next. The children are shown where the books are and can pick their own book. There is a variety of books to choose from: fiction, non-fiction, a favourite author or something completely different to what they have read before.

When speaking to the children about their library, it is clear that it is somewhere they enjoy going. They are keen to spend time in the library and discover more stories to capture their imaginations. The children are keen to spend time reading – be that in the library or different areas around the school. One child told me the reason they like reading is because it is 'like TV in my head' and another said 'a good book pulls you in so you forget everything else'.

As the children using the library range from year R to year 6, there needs to be a variety of books to entertain them all and appeal to all ages. When asked, the children all told me their favourite authors which were very varied! The authors they favoured included: JK Rowling, Jeff Kinney, Liz Pichon, Katherine Rundall and Jill Murphy. The library area is used for a variety of activities, the main one being the library, but the space is also used as an area for children to have some one-to-one interaction and group work in smaller groups. This helps to enhance and develop their learning and the library is a calming environment in which to carry out this work.

In the past the children have completed a sponsored read to raise funds for more books. This is something that the children are keen to do again as there are always new books coming out which they would love to have in their library. #### The Rectory, Woolton Hill

#### Dear Friends,

The season of Lent begins this month with Ash Wednesday on 22<sup>nd</sup> February. So as I write this in early January I am still clearing the Christmas decorations in one part of the Rectory, whilst here in my study I am thinking ahead to Lent devotions and services. Lent is the season in the Church year which particularly calls us to personal discipline and reflection. And so we find that a month which we often think of as the dullest and coldest of the year begins the Church season in which we are called to make the greatest efforts with our faith. Not that it is any easier of course to be devout in warm weather (when many other distractions abound!), so the challenge of a cold winter month might prove to be a further spur to discipline!

For keen gardeners a February job is to get out in the garden and start digging – turning over the soil and enriching it for a new season. It sounds hard work if you ask me! But I do know that it is preparation that will pay many dividends in the garden later in the year. How appropriate to match that outdoor preparation with the spiritual discipline of reflection. *'Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ'* are the rather blunt words that remind us of the reality of our lives in the Ash Wednesday service. I think it does no harm to be so starkly reminded of the need to make the effort to turn over our interior lives and enrich our faith. Some ways of doing this might be a little more focus on prayer and spiritual reading or practising a little self-denial by giving up some luxury. Add into this mix a fresh focus on how we contribute to the common good through compassion and care for others and then the ingredients of Lent devotions are in place.

Hard work it may be – but how satisfying it can be in February to get those gardening jobs done – to get the garden cleared of last year's debris, to be able to see more clearly the structure of the garden and prepare it for the new season, digging and pruning as appropriate. It is just as satisfying to get those spiritual jobs in hand too – taking time to clear the clutter from our lives, so that we may be less focused on our own desires and more able to look beyond ourselves, to look to Christ, to look to the world around us and to the wellbeing of all. Let's get digging...!


### National Women's Register
