East Woodhay Local History Society

ave Stubbs came in January to talk about the 'History of Thames Valley Police'. He is, as many will know, a retired Newbury police officer and currently a volunteer at the Police Museum at Sulhamstead.

Dave is a talented speaker who gave us an excellent, entertaining talk on the subject. He started with the medieval origins of a police force where Tything Men and Thief Takers were the early forms plus the origins of 'hue and cry'. It was very much a local system and relied on the community to be involved. After that towns and boroughs had their own



systems but it was not until the Peterloo Massacre in 1819 that Sir Robert Peel brought about legislation that resulted in a police system that we would recognise todav.

Newbury had its own force with the Police Station situated in Pelican Lane. Eventually it combined with the Berkshire Police before amalgamating with Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire, and other areas to become the Thames Valley Police. This has the largest territorial area of any police force in the country, stretching from Newbury to Milton Keynes. Nowadays, there is much more liaising with other forces such as, in our case, Hampshire.

Dave ended with looking at the modern force and how it had changed since he joined in 1968. Types of crime have changed considerably, and many police stations have closed due to more communication being done online. However, the general feeling of the meeting was that we need to get back to more local community liaising as it was long ago.

Our final meeting of this season will be on Monday March 20th at 8pm in Heath End Village Hall. Joy Appleton will be talking about the Boxford History project and how a community dig uncovered the Roman Mosaic.



Thank you to all those who took part in this year's EWS birdwatch, which is run alongside the RSPB January count.


There were 28 different species identified in our gardens and the winner, returning to the top spot is... Blue Tit. Previous winners have also been Chaffinch and Goldfinch.

East Woodhay Parish Council

he referendum for the East Woodhay Parish Neighbourhood Plan (NP) was held on 19th January. The parish council was delighted with the successful result of the referendum, where 95% voted in favour of the NP. The results of the poll included: 446 votes in favour (95.1%) and 22 votes against (4.7%). The referendum received a turn out of 20.5%. More than 50% of those voting in the referendum voted 'yes' and therefore the NP has become part of the BDBC statutory development plan for the parish.

This great result was the culmination of a number of years of hard work from the plan team, all who were volunteers. The council would like to thank all the people who contributed to the generation of the plan over the years, including members of the community who gave such valuable feedback and ideas throughout the process.

The plan will now be used to determine relevant planning applications in the parish by BDBC planning. The next step is for the plan to be formally 'made' at full BDBC cabinet meeting which is scheduled to happen late in February. After this, the plan will be subject to a 6 week period of legal challenge, managed by BDBC.

Copies of the NP will continue to be found on the EWPC and BDBC websites.



The Vegetable that Changed World History': a talk by Stefan White

There is a very famous painting by Vincent van Gogh of this very vegetable. The painting is called 'The Potato Eaters' and it can



be found in the Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam. Completed in 1885, it is one of van Gogh's earlier figure studies which shows the everyday lives of people who worked on the land. By this date, the potato had become a staple part of the European diet; it is said that Frederick the Great of Prussia put a guard around his potato field which led to his subjects stealing the plants and growing them in their own gardens and that Marie Antoinette wore the flowers of the potato plant in her hair to dispel the myth of it being a poisonous plant.

Van Gogh would be familiar with these tales and of the 'Potato Riots' in Russia in 1844 and the Irish famine caused by the potato blight which was rampaging across Europe in 1841.

I wonder if this 'newsworthy' vegetable was one of van Gogh's favourite to eat! Perhaps the method of cooking invented by Antoine-Augustin Parmentier (1737-1813), which involves cutting the potatoes into 2cm cubes and oven cooking with olive oil, rosemary and garlic would be the top favourite (it is mine), or patatas bravas, a similar dish but served with a warm, paprika and tomato sauce which has been eaten in Madrid as a tapas dish since 1542. Potatoes were first brought to Spain by the Conquistadors in 1533 after being discovered as part of the diet of the Inca civilisation. It is quite incredible that the potato grew in the diverse geographical regions of Chile and Peru, from sub-polar to semi-arid desert and varying heights from sea level to mountains over 1000 metres. It is not surprising that this highly adaptable plant is now grown all over the world.





The potato (Solanum Tuberosum) is a member of the Solanum or 'nightshade' genus, which also includes the tomato and the aubergine or egg plant. Parts of the potato are poisonous - the stems. leaves, flowers, green skin, and sprouts - due to the presence of two toxins, solanine and chaconine. There are similar kinds of toxins in the leaves, stems and flowers of tomatoes and aubergines.

Other members of the wider family Solanaceae are belladonna, mandrake, Physalis, Petunia, Nicotiana and all members of the pepper or Capsicum genus. Fortunately, the fruits of Physalis and Capsicums are safe to eat. With tomatoes, aubergines and peppers all being members of the potato family, I'm not sure why van Gogh chose to paint people eating potatoes. I would have chosen people eating tomatoes; far more colourful for a painting!


