'Encouraging Wildlife into Your Garden' a talk by Andrew Halstead

any gardeners are delighted when they find earthworms in their soil and brandling worms in the compost heap; that little spider making a web on a branch on an autumn morning and the goldfinches flying to a bird feeder. But Andrew, who is an entomologist at RHS Wisley, sent our heads spinning with anticipation as he described the exact conditions required for attracting orange tip and tortoiseshell butterflies: solitary bees, such as the carder bee and the leaf-cutting bee: tinv black wasps and different beetles. including one that looks like a wasp, into our gardens. Once your garden has become a haven for insects, other animals will begin to follow, different species of birds, hedgehogs, slow worms, field mice and shrews.

So, what do we need in our gardens to create this habitat? First choose as many different species and types of plants as is possible in your space, focusing mainly on native plants. Begin with the canopy, perhaps hawthorn and silver birch which can have 300 different insect species living in them; next a shrub layer to provide protection as animals move around the garden - pollarded



willow, dogwood or Guelder rose and then climbing plants to provide open flowers and berries for bees and birds, such as blackberry (there are thornless varieties) and ivv. Underplant these with perennial herbaceous plants - sedums, euphorbias, bryony, loosestrife and thistles leaving all the stems, foliage and seed heads in the border until spring.

However, as we all probably know, the single most important habitat to introduce into our gardens is water, even if this is simply a plastic bowl with some soil in the base. topped up with rainwater sitting on a balcony or outside the back door! Oxygenating plants and marginal plants growing in and around a pond will bring water boatmen, damsel flies, copepods, pond skaters and even tadpoles and frogs. Arquably. the most challenging habitat for many of us to provide is the unmown lawn because it will provide cover for spiders, ants, ground beetles, grasshoppers and slow worms. Could you leave the lawn to grow long OR introduce a tiny pond, OR leave all your perennials to die back naturally next winter OR even introduce one of the wildlife-friendly plants? I really hope you will join me in trialling this type of gardening! To find out more about this topic, I can recommend the RSPB website which has lots of advice and tips.

National Women's Register

he amazing sight of a table displaying around 20 pairs and individual Chinese Lotus Shoes greeted NWR members as they arrived for their Wednesday evening meeting. Wearing Lotus shoes was a unique footwear style in China for which women endured the painful custom of footbinding. It is said to have been inspired by a 10th century court dancer, Yao Niang, who danced on the tips of her toes before Emperor Li Yu. He was entranced by her so gradually other court ladies took



up footbinding making it a status symbol and a mark of feminine beauty among the elite. The lower classes also began footbinding as in some provinces it improved marriage prospects. It is estimated that by the 19th century 40-50 % of all Chinese women had bound feet. Binding would start when a girl was between the ages of 5 and 8, with all but the big toe bent under and backwards towards the heel. One cannot comprehend the pain these girls suffered.

Many of the shoes were beautifully decorated with silk and embroidery. Different colours for different

occasions, red ones for ceremonial events like weddings. The "Golden Lotus Shoe" was just 11cms long and this was the desired size that the women wished to achieve. Most of the women would be engaged in producing these shoes as their capacity for work would be limited by their difficulty in standing or walking for any length of time. The shoe got its name from the resemblance the bound foot had to a Lotus flower bud. In 1912 the new Republic of China banned foot binding but the practice carried on in some regions into the 1930's.

We also saw original Door of Hope Dolls. At the beginning of the 20th century destitute young Chinese women would seek refuge at the Door of Hope Mission in Shanghai. They would be given shelter and in return hand made these dolls, dressed in costumes representing the various classes of people in China, for the Mission to sell. These original dolls are much sought after by doll collectors.



Dear Friends,

As Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II served so faithfully for so many years there are not many of us who can recall the Coronation Service. This month sees this most momentous of occasions again as King Charles III is crowned at Westminster Abbey on Saturday 6th May. Excitement will build once more as we celebrate both nationally and locally!

The ceremony is rooted in longstanding traditions, but there will be some changes as the service will also reflect the King's role today and look to the future. For example throughout the Coronation weekend we know that themes of community life, volunteering and service will be highlighted and celebrated both nationally and locally.

At the heart of the service is a ritual in which the Archbishop of Canterbury anoints the King with oil. This is a custom which, with roots in the Old Testament, can be traced back to the Coronation of King Edgar by St Dunstan in 973. At King Charles' coronation the oil will come from the Mount of Olives and will have been consecrated for this use in a special ceremony at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem by the local Patriarch and Anglican Archbishop. This outward and visible act of anointing of King Charles signifies an inward grace and we pray that God will set apart King Charles to serve the people of our nation and Commonwealth with humility and joy.

To support our preparations the Church of England has provided daily readings and prayers for the four weeks leading up to the Coronation. Although we will be part way through these by the time you read this, all will be still available on the Church of England website. The resources have helped us to pray for the King, the Queen Consort and the Royal Family; for the family of nations to which we belong and to explore the symbolism and spiritual significance of the Coronation Service.

As we join the celebrations and gather locally in special Coronation Thanksgiving services on Sunday 7th May we will be praying for the King to receive grace to carry out this momentous task to which he has been called. As we do this may we also pray for ourselves that we too, with him, may receive the grace needed to carry out those things to which we have been called.



St Thomas Infants and Woolton Hill Juniors have both been graded 'Good' by OFSTED during recent inspections.

In the last 18 months we have worked to create a high quality, clearly structured and properly sequenced curriculum that offers continuity between Infants and Juniors. Our high quality teachers seek to deliver this in an exciting manner that makes learning 'irresistible' for all pupils.

The assessment undertaken by Ofsted is confirmation that the ambitious goals we set ourselves are the right ones and that we are making great progress!

OFTED said; "Leaders, teachers and governors are highly ambitious for this school and the pupils who attend it. They have worked hard to improve the quality of education for pupils since the schools federated in 2020. Pupils are proud to attend this happy village school."

Inspectors recognised that Vision and Values, launched last year, are central to our approach. "Staff have high expectations for all pupils. Leaders ensure that every pupil's 'light shines'."

Other areas of the curriculum were also highlighted by the inspectors. "Lessons are purposeful and pupils work hard. Leaders have redesigned subject content to ensure that pupils learn 'an irresistible curriculum'. They have identified the most important knowledge, skills and vocabulary that they want pupils to learn, year by year, subject by subject."

In the Infant School report, OFSTED noted that "Reading is taught well

I was pleased to see the positive comments about our maths provision. "In maths children are taught key number fluency and reasoning skills through concrete, pictorial and abstract approaches. This enables pupils to embed their knowledge and understanding."

Inspectors highlighted behaviour as a strength of the junior school. "They know the three school rules, 'accept, behave, and care' well. They follow instructions and are polite and respectful. Strong relationships permeate throughout the school so that pupils feel safe. Bullying is rare and staff deal with any incidents quickly."

Another area of focus for the school has been our provision and support for children with special educational needs (SEN). This was commented on by the inspector. "Pupils with SEN have their needs met through good leadership, clear systems and effective passports for success." Our inclusive ethos to learning really stood out, especially at the juniors, where this has really improved. We enable all pupils to "find their thing"; and in this we enable pupils to "let their light shine";

I am delighted with the result of both inspections, but we are far from ready to stand still. There is still much to do. Our ethos is very much about continuous improvement and our aim is to be 'Outstanding' by the time of the next inspection.

Backgrounding ref Current State of Roads

There is understandable concern by parishioners about the state of our local major and minor roads. East Woodhay Parish Council (EWPC) is very much aware of the number of potholes in the roads and lanes of the parish and echoes the dissatisfaction of parishioners at the steady and now unacceptable deterioration both of this essential local infrastructure and of the main A343 highway between Penwood and the A34.

However, the EWPC has no responsibility or authority for allocation of county resources to the maintenance of local highways. Nonetheless, over recent years it has continually sought to highlight these



increasing problems to Hampshire County Council, through local County Councillor Tom Thacker, and latterly by direct communications with the HCC Highways Engineering department.

Assurances have now been obtained from the HCC Highways

team that further heavy patching repairs are planned for the A343 for the first guarter of the 2023/24 financial year to resolve the current issues and that they will be working with their delivery team to ensure there is no repeat of the recent problems faced with local misleading diversions. EWPC, together with its neighbouring parish councils, will continue to maintain pressure on the elected representatives of Hampshire County Council, and on local MP Kit Malthouse to maintain local infrastructure at an acceptable level.

Parish Project Fulfilment

EWPC has control over the allocation of resources obtained under S106 arrangements from developers, in particular relating to the Meadowbrook development. Having fought to prevent this money being allocated elsewhere in the county, it has financed and managed a number of projects for the benefit of the community.

Successfully completed projects include the provision of enhanced recreation facilities, suitable crossing access at Brownie's corner for wheelchairs and child buggies, a pedestrian footway along Tile Barn Row and a car parking lay-by to improve access to the Doctors' surgery in Trade Street and to smooth through traffic flow.

EWPC will continue to work within its limited resources to deliver local benefit for its parishioners wherever possible.






