

# EW LH<sup>5</sup>

#### Local History Society visit to Hungerford 21st May 2023

ineteen members of East Woodhay Local History Society were very lucky to enjoy a beautiful sunny day for our guided walk around Hungerford on the 21st May.

Our guides were Hugh and Lois Pihlens who treated us to some fascinating insights into Hungerford's history. Hugh used the architectural features of the buildings to illustrate the growth and development of the town. It was wonderful to have details pointed out which you would easily overlook if just strolling along the High Street. For instance, the oldest house has a very ordinary pebble dash frontage and modern windows which give no clues as to the medieval timber framed hall house within. Many of the houses have grand Georgian frontages which date from the days when Hungerford became a bustling coaching stop on the London to Bath Road. However, Hugh pointed out that almost all of these are just brick or tile frontages with medieval wooden framed houses behind. The High Street was a planned street with a market which had developed by the late 12th century and focused on the intersection of the north / south and east / west routes through the town.



We walked down to the Croft where the original settlement was and that of course is where you find St Lawrence's Church. The current church was opened in 1816 and is built of Bath stone, brought to Hungerford along the canal.

We followed the canal towpath and ended our walk in the war memorial garden which forms an island between two branches of the River Dun. This was the site of the Priory of St John which offered hospitality to travellers in the Middle Ages. We were amazed to discover that for centuries the entrance to Hungerford town from the north and the east was through a long ford, now a lovely clear chalk stream.

# Swarming Season is Almost Over

Swarming is a natural phenomenon for honey bees. It is their way of splitting a colony into two that has grown too big for its current home, albeit a hive or any other location where it has set up home. The worker bees (all female) will create a new gueen by feeding a larva with a substance called 'royal jelly' and it is the old gueen who will leave taking half the workers with her, approximately 20,000 bees.

It can be guite daunting for the public to see a cluster of honey bees when they have swarmed, as they could "land" anywhere temporarily, as these pictures show. The one in the tree is more normal but fence posts, car door handles, wheelie bins or anywhere else, as the chair shows. The swarm will cluster around the gueen while scouts move out to find a suitable permanent location. Once they have done so the whole swarm will move off and set up shop in its chosen new home. They could stay in this temporary location for a day or so but it could be less than half an hour. There is no set formula: they are a law unto themselves. So if you see a swarm and want a beekeeper to collect it then time is of the essence. Newbury Bee Keepers Association has a central number where swarms can be reported on 07555 180 260 and a team of people ready to help. The service is free but as with all charities donations are always welcome.

The bees will fill up on honey from the hive before they swarm and while looking guite menacing they are normally in guite a chilled state, as they have full stomachs and they don't have a home or food supply to defend or any voung to protect.

The swarming season is typically between mid-April and the end of July so by the time you read this the season will almost be over for another year.

## National Women's Register

An annual favourite topic, "An article from a recent newspaper", once again gave us a most entertaining and fun meeting. Animals featured in several clips; cat burglar Harvey's haul was varied and included slippers, sausages, a purse and items from washing lines. The euthanisation of Freya the Walrus caused outrage in Norway and £20,000 was soon raised to erect a statue in her memory. Sloth fur appears to harbour antibiotic-producing bacteria that scientists hope may hold a solution to "superbugs" resistant to humanity's dwindling arsenal of drugs.

One film we might not be eager to view is from Japan and advocates state administered euthanasia after the age of 75. Those people signing up to this would receive £1000 to spend in their last year.

Despite bullfighting continuing we learned that the dwarfs, who used to perform at bullfights, are to be banned so they are now unemployed.

The original toe-rag was a piece of rag wrapped between the toes as a substitute for a sock and used by 19th century transported convicts.

The death of Barry Humphries gave us time to recount the many jokes and fun memories this very popular entertainer had given us.

We also were saddened to learn that some of our second-hand clothing donated to charities is washed up on African beaches and although recycling is very important perhaps with textiles we should try to encourage people who donate also to purchase from charity shops.

We spent an interesting afternoon finding out about local villages, many of which are mentioned in the Doomsday Book in 1086 and have fascinating histories.

A Neolithic axe head from 5000 years ago has been found in Peasemore set in the Berkshire Downs. Donnington dates from Saxon times but Donnington Castle, built in 1386, was a victim of the Civil War, demolished by the Parliamentarians in 1646 leaving only the gatehouse standing. The Marshall suffix was appended to Hamstead and named after William Marshall who, as chief advisor to William 1, was gifted the land. In early 17th century the manor was acquired by the Craven family, who owned the village until 1934, when death duties resulted in a massive sell off while the large, vibrant village of Kingsclere can be traced back to King Alfred, and the thriving village of Kintbury on the River Kennet means fort. Its church has a beautiful tower and a Jane Austen connection. In 1810 Charles Dundas opened the Kennet & Avon canal. Laverstoke Mill on the River Test produced paper for banknotes until

1963. The mill was purchased by the Bombay Spirits company in 2010, and now visitors can learn how gin is produced, as well as how to make delicious cocktails. There is evidence of a hunting lodge in 11th Century West Woodhay while the present West Woodhay house was built in 1635 to an Inigo Jones design for Sir Benjamin Rudyard, a poet & politician.



It was the end of a busy period of sorting and decamping from our lovely home SW of Oxford and preparing for my new, very part-time, role joining our Rector and serving as Associate Priest in these parishes. It is *great* to be here! But moving can be stressful!

We lived in Oxfordshire (our third time) for almost 20 years, after I stepped down as Dean of Bradford Cathedral to return to academia; particularly, to on-going work in India (from the mid-1990s) and to teaching in China's leading universities. From 2010, my work with Oxford House has been global (www. oxfordhouseresearch.com), helping to coordinate a great team of folk to ensure culture, ethics and religion are fully and wisely integrated in analysis, intel and diplomacy. We got it so wrong in Iraq and Afghanistan! The work has been – and remains – a huge, humbling, unplanned, privilege. Over the years, I have travelled 100s of 1000s of miles to conferences, meetings, and teaching (thankfully, like many organizations, Oxford House has discovered virtual meetings work!). In recent years, I have found online Chess a useful distraction: games – and very frequent defeats – help pass the time on long-haul flights.

Though we can never fully understand how God works, behind Suzie and my decision to move here, we sense a divine Chess 'Grand Master' on the other side of the board, who watches our moves and responds in ways that are good for us and fulfil his game plan. Yes, we can make faith hard, and invent all sorts of excuses, when God in Jesus still issues his simple, gracious, invitation, 'Come, follow me'. Anyway, that's why we're here, and we look forward to meeting you!

#### Residential fun at The Schools of Woolton Hill

In the spring and summer terms at The Schools of Woolton Hill, Year 4 and 6 get to experience a residential trip. The trips consist of a few days away with their classmates and teachers to learn skills of independence, further build on relationships with peers, and bring even more excitement to

their everyday learning.

Next, the children were able to have a try at sailing. Starting with learning about the all important sailing terms and

parts of the boat, as well as how to rig their boat, they set off in teams to sail the Southampton East Cowes water.

The activities didn't stop there, with the rest of the week filled with rock climbing, kayaking and even skiing!

Paul Davies, Headteacher at The Schools of Woolton Hill said, "Our school is extremely lucky to be able to take the children away on residential trips. Outdoor learning and learning away from the classroom really does engage the children and give them opportunities to learn new skills that they may never come across in their everyday lives. Staying away from their families enables them to build on their independence, which is important when they go onto




#### **Trees at Wisley Gardens in May**

#### Toona sinensis 'Flamingo', Cornus Ruth Ellen 'Rutlan' and Trachycarpus fortunei

uring the month of May there always seems to be a particular moment when perfection is achieved in the tree canopy and leaves appear as if from nowhere to cast soft shadows underfoot. A few members of the Gardening Club were fortunate enough to experience this moment during a visit to the Royal



Horticultural Society Gardens at Wisley. During a previous visit some years ago in early May I had been astonished to find a 'pink' tree. This tree was the beautiful Toona sinensis 'Flamingo' and I took photos and even purchased a tiny specimen to bring home. I was very keen to see this tree again and was not disappointed. The bark and leaves were pink as I had remembered. The tree is a member of the mahogany family, native to China, and a mature specimen will reach 40 metres in height and produce flowers in July, followed by brownish-red seed pods. You can find this tree at the far end of the double herbaceous border at Wisley.



On walking down the steps towards the lake I was surprised to see a Chusan Palm or Trachycarpus in full flower. I hadn't realised




that this tree could grow outdoors but the one at Wisley is a mature specimen and I'm sure they wrap it up well during the winter. Trachycarpus fortunei is a native of Asia, found from Myanmar to China. It has the usual fibre-covered stubby trunk and evergreen fan-shaped leaves. It is dioecious and after flowering the female plant may produce small fruits. It will be interesting to visit Wisley again in summer and look for these fruits.

Woolton Hill and District Gardeners' Club is affiliated to the RH, which allows us one free visit to Wisley annually for 55 members. Late spring is an incredible time to visit and I am already looking forward to returning next year. If you didn't join us this time and would like to know more about the

new improved Wisley Garden, please talk to me at our next meeting. Maybe in 2024 we can use all 55 of our free entries!


