Latest Government Guidance

Covid-19 is still with us and still a serious illness. Unfortunately, it is quite possible that you may have contracted Covid-19 and be spreading it without having any symptoms. Without a test you can never be sure.

That is why it is important we all still maintain the rules around social distancing. It is known that Covid-19 can last much less time in the open air rather than indoors. That is why the guidance is to only meet people from other households outdoors in a park or in your garden, not indoors.

From Monday in England, you will be able to meet in groups of up to six people from different households outside - either in parks or now also in private gardens - as long as you remain 2m (6ft) apart. But, if you have a picnic or a BBQ each household should bring its own food, plates cutlery etc to avoid spreading coronavirus through those items.

There is no longer any limit to the amount of time you can spend outside doing exercise, or in "open-air recreation" like sunbathing.

Households can also drive any distance in England to destinations such as parks and beaches. But they should not travel to Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland, where the rules are different.

Government guidance is changing frequently, and new guidance is due out shortly. To access that information go to https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/staying-safe-outside-your-home/staying-safe-outside-your-home and look for updates to be published soon.

Remember it is the responsibility of everyone to use common sense to reduce the risk of Covid-19 spreading.

We visit homes that are large and small, some along narrow lanes, passing fields, hedgerows and trees, the birdsong music to our ears and on reaching our destination the thanks for the delivery service

We the ones who are out there are the lucky ones, delivering in the fresh spring air.

We thank the organisers, the planners, the tacticians, the generals sending out their troops to help the young and the old, the sick and those who just need a little help. We thank you one and all. So off we set along our way. First drop post code installed, where would we be without SAT NAV and 'Just Three Words'.

The name of the house is clearly spelt, the post code has delivered us to where we are. The house must be here. "You look left" I say to my wife, "I will look right". "Oh where are you house?".
